Basic Sciences in the Caribbean

Spend five semesters (20 months) studying Basic Sciences at one of our Caribbean medical campuses in Anguilla and St. Vincent. Our campuses offer a positive learning environment and a safe, supportive community with one-on-one tutoring and mentoring. Basic Science Review Course (BSRC) - Preparation for the USMLE

Intensive preparation for the USMLE Step 1 begins with Basic Science Review Course (BSRC), which takes place during the fifth semester on campus in the Caribbean.

Students will engage in an extensive Basic Science review to prepare for the USMLE Step 1. Students will apply conceptual knowledge to demonstrate the fundamental patient-centered skills, upon which USMLE is focused; as well as an integration of all disciplines using a system-based approach.

At the conclusion of BSRC you will be well prepared to sit for the USMLE step 1 exam and commence clinical rotations.

Clinical Rotations in US Hospitals

The Clinical Sciences component of your MD Program is completed over five semesters (80 weeks) at affiliated hospitals and clinical facilities in the US. We have strong partnerships with teaching hospitals in Chicago, a world-class city for clinical clerkships and medical residencies, as well as a strong network of hospital affiliations throughout the US.

Clinical training at Saint James School of Medicine is divided into 48 weeks of core clerkships and 32 weeks of electives.

OUR ACCREDITATIONS AND RECOGNITIONS

RECOGNIZED IN THE US & CANADA

- In 2015, the Anguilla campus was granted initial provisional accreditation by the Caribbean Authority for Education in Medicine (CAAM-HP).
- Saint James School of Medicine St. Vincent campus is registered with the National Accreditation Board (NAB) of the Government of St. Vincent and the Grenadines.
- The Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) has granted permission for our students to take the USMLE exam and apply for ECFMG certification, as required for entry into a residency program in the US.
- Recognized by the Medical Council of Canada. Our students are eligible to sit the Medical Council of Canada Evaluating Examination (MCCEE), and sit Part I & Part II of the Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination (MCCQE) for their Licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada (LMCC)
- Listed in the World Directory for Medical Schools which has been developed through a partnership between the World Federation for Medical Education (WFME) and the Foundation for Advancement of International Medical Education and Research (FAIMER).
