

Leading the Ebola response in Liberia

Through her fearless commitment to improving disease treatment and prevention across her home country of Liberia, Neima Candy has saved countless lives. After completing a Masters of Public Health at the University of Newcastle in 2013, she returned to Liberia as a Technical Assistant with the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare. During the Ebola crisis, Neima was appointed National Ebola Coordinator for the Liberian Red Cross, leading a team of 100 staff members and 2,850 volunteers in the fight to end the epidemic sweeping the country. In 2016, Neima was awarded the Advance Global Alumni Award at the Advance Global Australian Awards for her contribution to eliminating the Ebola virus in Liberia.

We have been a leader in Indigenous education in Australia for more than 30 years, and the work of our Wollotuka Institute is world-renowned. We're proud to have one of the largest Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander enrolments in Australia.

THE WOLLOTUKA INSTITUTE

The Wollotuka Institute is committed to the advancement and leadership of Indigenous education at a local, national and international level. It also continues to draw strength from culture, communities and past journeys.

It provides our international students with the opportunity to learn about Australian Indigenous history.

Wollotuka provides support services to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students studying at the University of Newcastle, and delivers degree programs specialising in Indigenous studies – including a new Bachelor of Global Indigenous Studies (from 2019). It also provides teaching


services for faculties within the University such as the Faculty of Health and Medicine, and undertakes research functions on projects and grants with partners across the University and the higher education sector.

The University reached the milestone of over 1,000 Indigenous enrolments in 2016, the first time that any Australian university has achieved this. We recently became the first institute in Australia to receive accreditation from the World Indigenous Nations Higher Education Consortium (WINHEC), recognising our strong outcomes within Australian Indigenous Higher Education.

We acknowledge the traditional Aboriginal owners of the lands on which our offices are located: the Pambalong Clan of the Awabakal Nation (Newcastle), Darkinung People (Central Coast) and Biripai People (Port Macquarie). We also acknowledge and pay respect to the other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nations from which our students, staff and community are drawn.

Newcastle truly embodies the spirit of new. The city draws entrepreneurs, artists, technologists, and visionaries. Newcastle is quickly evolving into a global leader in city development. Innovative initiatives earned Newcastle a spot among National Geographic's 2017 Smart Cities.

Newcastle is home to beautiful beaches and is an easy day trip away from the stunning natural beauty of Port Stephens, Barrington Tops National Park and Lake Macquarie, the largest coastal salt water lake in Australia. The verdant Hunter Valley, where some of the world's finest wines are made, is also a quick train or bus trip away.

With over 500,000 residents, Newcastle is one of Australia's biggest small cities. 



FOUNDATION AND DIPLOMAS

NEWCASTLE INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE

Newcastle International College (NIC) provides international students with an alternative pathway to the University of Newcastle. Small class sizes and one-on-one time with lecturers help students build the confidence needed to succeed in their studies and progress to university. NIC is part of Navitas, a world leader in education and training. NIC's accredited Foundation and Diploma programs can lead to most of the undergraduate degrees currently available at the University. Study areas include: Business and Law, Education and Arts, Health and Medicine, Engineering, IT and Media. NIC is located at the University's Callaghan campus, and works closely with the University's international team as well as the English Language Centre in arranging packaged enrolments for students to ensure a seamless transition to their university studies.

NIC also offers an international pathway to the Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine. The Foundation Program for Medicine (FPM) is an 8 month course with an intake commencing in April each year. A minimum of four places in the Bachelor of Medical Science/Doctor of Medicine program are reserved for successful graduates of the NIC FPM who meet the progression rules and are successful in the selection process. No more than 30 students are accepted into the FPM each year.

Hunter TAFE is an education provider in the Newcastle and surrounding area which provides diplomas in a range of professional fields. The D2D program allows international students to undertake a one-year diploma and, if successful, gain admission into the corresponding bachelor degree at the University of Newcastle. This also allows students to transfer credits from their diploma to their degree, and potentially complete their bachelor degree in a shorter time.

COSTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Tuition, the cost of teaching, is the main fee that you will pay to the University. International students pay a deposit fee when they accept their offer to study at the University. The deposit will first be allocated toward Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) and the remaining amount will be put toward the first term's tuition fees and the Student Services Amenities Fee (SSAF).

The price of tuition varies for each student, based on your level of study, program of study, and the individual courses that you take. The deposit may not cover the full cost of your first term of fees.

You may also be qualified to apply for a scholarship based on your home country, academic performance, or area of study. Scholarships include financial support for students from diverse backgrounds, rewards for academic excellence and funding for research students.
