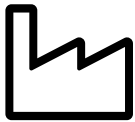

Note: On-campus students need to enrol in a minimum of three courses to comply with their student visa requirements. Students wishing to study online can choose to study a minimum of one course. Study Abroad students pay tuition to USQ and apply directly, through a partner university, agent or provider.

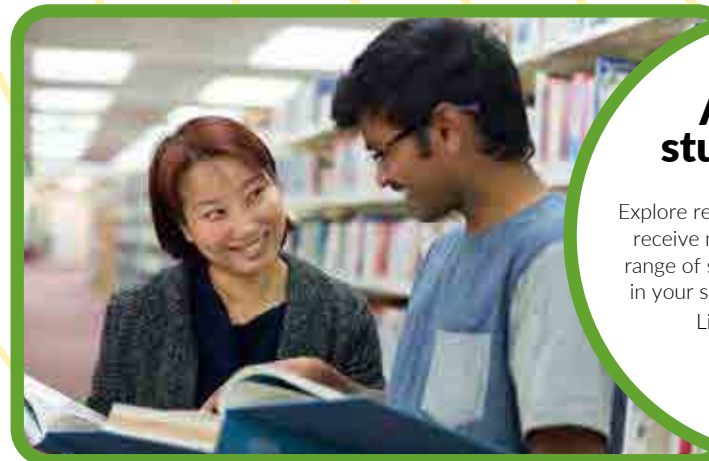

Professional accreditation

Graduates of the Bachelor of Aviation (Flight Operations) program will gain professional pilot qualifications issued by the Australian Civil Aviation Safety Authority.

- Upon graduation, students may have the opportunity to apply for entry into the Qantas Group Future Pilot Program. Please refer to the Qantas website for entry requirements.
- Students intending to undertake the Flight Operations major will be required to co-enrol with a specified flight training school at additional cost. Please contact USQ for further information on the application process.

Employers from certain countries and airlines may require an Australian Commercial Pilot Licence to be converted or transferred and may prescribe other requirements or qualifications as necessary. While this is not an admission requirement to the program, students planning to undertake the Flight Operations major will have to hold a Class 1 Medical Certificate issued by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority, as this is one of the regulatory requirements to hold a Commercial Pilot Licence. In addition, students in the Flight Operations major are expected to complete a recognised pilot aptitude assessment and interview prior to being allowed to undertake the Flight Operations major. Appropriate advice will be provided to students during the first academic year.

USQ is Australia's only university with both the **Boeing 737 and A320** flight simulators.

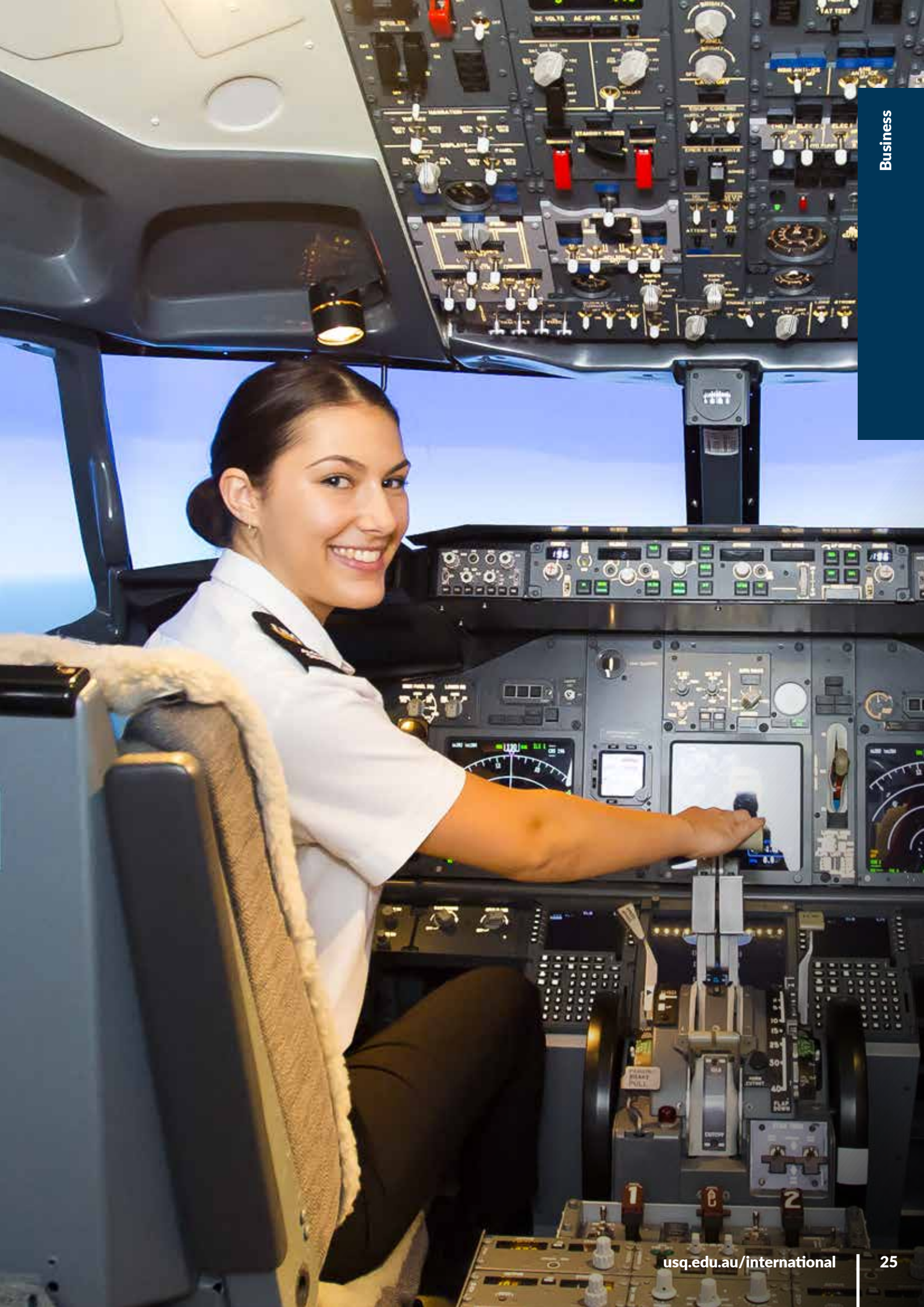

Professional accreditation

Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major graduates will meet the educational entrance requirements of CPA Australia and Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CAANZ). This provides Associate membership of CPA Australia, eligibility to study the CPA Australia professional exams and eligibility to study the CAANZ professional exams.

The Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major are accredited by the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA) and the Association of International Accountants (AIA).

Successful completion of the Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major can qualify students for exemptions from the Fundamental level (9 papers) of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) exams.

Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major students who complete a Finance minor will meet the educational entrance requirements of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia (Finsia).

Students who wish to be registered tax agents must complete the Accounting (Extended) major and complete LAW3444 Competition and Consumer Law as an elective in order to meet the educational entrance requirements of the Tax Practitioners Board.

Finance major graduates will meet the educational entrance requirements to become a member of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia (Finsia).





The Human Resource Management major is accredited by the Australian Human Resources Institute (AHRI) and satisfies the educational requirements for professional membership of AHRI.

The Marketing major is accredited by the Australian Marketing Institute (AMI), and students are eligible for credit towards becoming a Certified Practising Marketer (CPM) upon completion.
