- Enrol as a visiting student with a letter of permission.





Proof of English Proficiency is required for all applicants who have not:

- MELAB: Overall score of 81, with a minimum score of 3+ in speaking, 80 in writing, 83 in reading, and 80 in listening
- CanTEST: Minimum score of 4.5 in speaking, 4.0 in writing, 4.5 in reading, and 4.5 in listening

English Proficiency Tests

CLB, IELTS (Academic) and TOEFL results are valid for two years from the day of testing. Results that expire prior to the Start Date of the program cannot be accepted. Official results must be submitted.

Gather Your Transcripts

When applying online to Bow Valley College through ApplyAlberta.ca, applicants authorize Bow Valley College to obtain their Alberta high school and post-secondary transcripts.

All other applicants must arrange for their transcripts to be sent to Bow Valley College, either through the provincial education department or the institution that issued the transcript(s). Transcripts can be submitted by mail to the Registrar's Office (see address under step #5).

5 Pay the non-refundable application fee

> In order for us to process your application, you must pay the non-refundable application fee.

Applying Online: Pay using Visa or MasterCard or choose the "Pay Later" option.

Pay Later: Your application information will be held until payment is made. Applicants can pay:

- by phone (403-410-1400) using Visa or MasterCard;
- in person, at the Office of the Registrar;
- by mail with a personal cheque, certified cheque, or money order to address below:

We strongly recommend applying a minimum of 12 – 13 months in advance of the intended start of your studies. Students are admitted on a firstqualified, first-admitted basis, so applying early and submitting all relevant documents is key.



Submitting Proof of Enrolment

If you are currently registered in courses that you need for admission to your program of interest, you will need to submit proof of enrolment.

Proof of enrolment must be issued by your school OR school board and include:

- Your name
- Course names AND course codes AND start and end dates of your courses
- Diploma exam date, if applicable
- Estimated date of graduation (for programs that require a high school diploma only)

The following types of documents may be submitted as proof of enrolment, provided that they include all of the details listed above:

- Course schedule
- Interim transcripts (please note that Alberta Education transcripts may not show in-progress courses)
- Letter from your school

If you are registered at Bow Valley College, email admissions@bowvalleycollege.ca with your Bow Valley College Student ID number and your program in the subject line so your application can be reassessed.

If you are scheduled to write an English proficiency test for admission to your program of interest, you will need to submit the following information:

- Your name
- Receipt and proof of test date for your English proficiency test (i.e., IELTS Academic, TOEFL)

How to submit your proof of enrolment documents

- Submit a PDF copy of your proof of enrolment (photos and screenshots are not acceptable) by email to admissions@bowvalleycollege.ca.
- In the subject line of your email, include your Bow Valley College ID number and the name of the program you have applied for.

You can drop off your documents in-person at the Office of the Registrar if you prefer.

After you submit your proof of enrolment

An Admissions Officer will review your proof of enrolment documents.

You may be granted Conditional Acceptance (or a Conditional Waitlist position) if your documents show that you will complete all of the admission requirements prior to the assigned deadline.

Students who are granted Conditional Acceptance will have their offer cancelled if they fail to achieve any of the required conditions (Example: minimum required grade in a course).

Bow Valley College offers a number of Entrance Awards for students applying to the College. These awards can range from one-time awards of \$1,000, to awards that are renewable to a maximum of \$10,000.


