

## ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES (EAP)

The English for Academic Purposes (EAP) certificate program, offered by Humber's English Language Centre, is an intensive, full-time academic pathway program. The program integrates reading, writing, listening and speaking skills with an academic focus, designed specifically for entry into college diploma, degree and graduate certificate programs or for further professional development.

#### **On-Campus Residence**


Humber provides residence for 1,450 students at our two campuses.

Humber emphasizes hands-on, careerfocused learning and develops graduates to be successful in careers that significantly contribute to the communities they serve. We hold the current and future success of our students as our highest priority.

### **CAREER SERVICES**

As a current student and alumnus, you will have access to Humber's Career Services. Our career and student advisors offer job search assistance, review your resume and cover letter, assist with interview preparation and employer connections, and help develop career management strategies.
