



On-Campus Residence


Humber provides residence for 1,450 students at our two campuses.

The \$500 CAD is non-refundable; please do not pay until you have been assigned a residence room.

Humber emphasizes hands-on, careerfocused learning and develops graduates to be successful in careers that significantly contribute to the communities they serve. We hold the current and future success of our students as our highest priority.

CAREER SERVICES

As a current student and alumnus, you will have access to Humber's Career Services. Our career and student advisors offer job search assistance, review your resume and cover letter, assist with interview preparation and employer connections, and help develop career management strategies.

CAREER EVENTS

Career Services host events give students the opportunity to learn about specific careers and connect with employers. WORKING WHILE STUDYING (PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT)

- Working off campus International students may qualify to work off campus without a work permit. If you qualify, your study permit will allow you to:
 - Work up to 20 hours per week during regular school sessions and;
