





TRANSFERRING TO SENECA

If you have prior postsecondary experience and want to continue your education at Seneca, you may be eligible to apply for transfer credits. If transfer credits are granted, they may fulfil academic requirements in your Seneca program. There are also

agreements in place that establish specific pathway details. For example, Seneca has established pathways with three colleges — Cambrian in Sudbury, Canadore in North Bay and Lambton in Sarnia — for their students to complete a degree or diploma at Seneca.

HELIX has helped aspiring entrepreneurs launch and accelerate 200+ ventures since 2014.

Please note that meeting minimum admission requirements for our programs does not guarantee admission.

Degrees

To be eligible, applicants must submit official transcripts showing completion or in progress status of all academic admission requirements.

Credentials (transcripts) from outside of Canada should be accompanied by a course-by-course evaluation from International Credential Assessment Service (ICAS) or World Education Services (WES). For questions about the documents and evaluations required for your program, contact admissions@senecacollege.ca.

Mature applicants who are 21 or older will be considered when Seneca receives transcripts showing successful final grades in the required academic courses. Mature applicants must also disclose any completed or attempted postsecondary studies.

Seneca offers degree completion and advanced-entry options for applicants who have postsecondary credentials. Visit senecacollege.ca/degreetransfer for information.

Graduate Certificates

To be eligible, applicants must submit official transcripts showing successful completion of a recognized university or college program of study.

Credentials (transcripts) from outside of Canada should be accompanied by a document evaluation from WES or ICAS. Some programs require a course-by-course evaluation. For questions about the documents and evaluations required for your program, contact admissions@senecacollege.ca.

All applicants to graduate certificate programs must demonstrate language proficiency at the postsecondary level; that is, two full years in a postsecondary institute in a country where English is the primary language or a successful score in an English language assessment.

Applicants to graduate certificate programs who have some postsecondary education and/or significant relevant work experience may be considered for admission at the discretion of Seneca.

Diplomas and Certificates

To be eligible, applicants must submit official transcripts showing successful completion or in progress status of all academic admission requirements. Credentials (transcripts) from outside of Canada must be accompanied by a document evaluation from WES or ICAS. Some programs require a course-by-course evaluation. Mature applicants who are 19 or older may be permitted to write the Pre-admission English and/or mathematics tests to qualify for admission. 

PAYING FOR YOUR STUDIES

At Seneca, we know that financial aid can be an important factor as you plan for your postsecondary studies. With a variety of financial assistance options to consider, we're here to guide you through the process and help you access the resources you need.

OSAP & Free Tuition

The Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) is a mix of grants and loans to help you pay for your postsecondary studies. Recently, changes have been made to OSAP as Ontario has bundled many existing provincial OSAP grants into a single Ontario Student Grant. The changes will make average college and university tuition free for the majority of eligible students whose family income is under \$50,000 per year.

There are also changes to OSAP grants and loans available to middle income families. There will be some additional costs such as ancillary fees, books, supplies and health care that you'll need to cover, even if you're eligible to receive free tuition under the OSAP program.

You can apply for OSAP at the same time as you apply for your program. It's important to start your OSAP application early because the sooner you apply, the sooner you can find out how much aid you may be able to get. For details, visit ontario.ca/osap

Scholarships, Bursaries & Awards

Each year, Seneca offers millions of dollars in scholarships, bursaries and other awards.

Bursaries are based on student financial need. For example, first-year students who qualify for Tuition Assistance Bursaries may be eligible for up to \$2,000 in tuition assistance toward a degree or \$1,000 toward a diploma or certificate.

Scholarships are awarded based on academic achievement. Students entering any of our degree programs may be eligible for a Renewable Degree Scholarship of up to \$1,000 per year based on academic achievement in Grade 12 or in a previous college or university program.

Some awards are open to all students while other awards are offered only to students in specific programs.

Seneca has a convenient online application where you can apply for our entrance awards and bursaries. It's a good idea to apply early for Seneca awards so you have the most up-to-date financial information when you confirm your program of study.
