INTO Glasgow Caledonian University is an examination centre for International English Language Testing System (IELTS) - the internationally recognised English language proficiency test. If you need to take an IELTS test, you can take one at the INTO GCU centre on campus.

### INTO GCU

If you need help with English language skills, the INTO Glasgow Caledonian University partnership can help. With English language programmes and academic preparation courses designed for international students, you can develop your skills before you even begin your postgraduate degree.

If you get a conditional offer, depending on minimum English language requirements, you'll be enrolled on a free, tutored online course to practice and improve your English in your own time.

An intensive pre-sessional, English course can improve your English skills to the level required for your postgraduate, while a Pre Masters, lasting 3 months, improves your English, alongside an academic project leading to your postgraduate. You can also undertake an International Graduate Diploma course to develop your academic and postgraduate research skills along with your English language ability.

Once you start your course, you'll have access to a free online tutoring module to work on your English, and you can monitor your progress by being assessed on arrival and throughout your studies.

You can also combine your English language preparation with a postgraduate degree in a single study plan. During your first year of study, you'll expand your postgraduate research skills and progress your English language understanding. After successful completion you'll continue directly into your Masters degree.

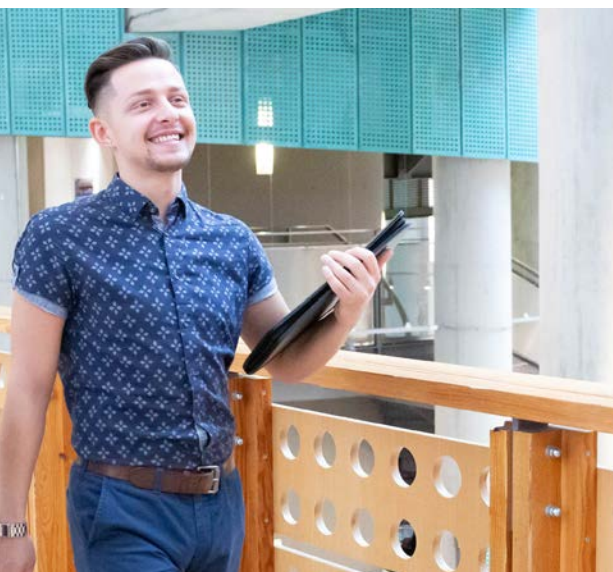

### Scholarships

Scholarships can contribute to the cost of tuition fees and travel and provide you with the support you need to complete your postgraduate qualification. They also provide fantastic opportunities in terms of networking, gaining work experience and inspiring you to do more with your time.

### Loyalty discount

If you previously studied here and you are from Scotland, the UK or the EU, you could be eligible for a loyalty discount of 20% off of your postgraduate tuition fees. The discount is available to students who have received their undergraduate or postgraduate or research degree qualification from GCU or one of our founding institutions.

If you are an international student from outside the EU and have successfully completed a degree, foundation or programme of study at GCU, your postgraduate course is eligible for up to £5,000 discount towards fees.

### Early payment discount

## Apply online

The easiest way to apply for a postgraduate course is online. The online application form is simple to complete and you will find an apply button next to the course of your choice on the GCU website. It's easy to upload all the documents needed to support your application and submit everything together.

For a small number of postgraduate courses, applications must be submitted via the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). Please note that some courses have application deadlines - full details of these may be found on our website.

## Additional documents

Some additional documents may be needed to support your application:

- Personal statement
- Letter of reference
- Academic or professional certificates
- Academic transcripts

## Write your personal statement

Your personal statement is your opportunity to tell us why you want to apply for your chosen course. You should use it to explain why you have chosen to study a particular postgraduate degree and to demonstrate your motivation and experience.





## International applications

We visit a wide range of countries and hold information events for prospective students. You can find full details of our upcoming visits and events on our website.

You can apply for your postgraduate degree using our online application form. As well as the additional supporting documents, please also provide a copy of your passport identification pages.

## Visas

You can get help with your visa application from our Visa Immigration Support and Advice (VISA) team, a professional service dedicated to supporting international students and their families while they study at GCU.

If you're from a country outside the European Economic Area you'll require a visa. To study a full-time course as a postgraduate or research student, you'll need to apply for a Tier 4 (General) visa.

For a Tier 4 (General) visa, you'll need a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) document.

Once you are given an unconditional offer, you need to pay the deposit for your fees to ensure your CAS is issued. If your course starts in September, we recommend you pay your deposit by 1 August to leave enough time for visa processing. If your course starts in January, pay your deposit before 1 December.

You will be eligible for an early payment discount of 5% off of your tuition fees if you meet these deadlines and pay the remaining tuition fees in full before the first day of teaching.

When you've paid the deposit, your CAS will be sent by email. You'll then need to fill in a visa application form, pay the application fee and prepare your supporting documents. Submit these documents to your local Visa Application Centre.

You may be asked to undertake a credibility interview with an Entry Clearance Officer as part of your visa application. Credibility interviews assess your genuine desire to study in the UK and you are expected to demonstrate your English Language ability.

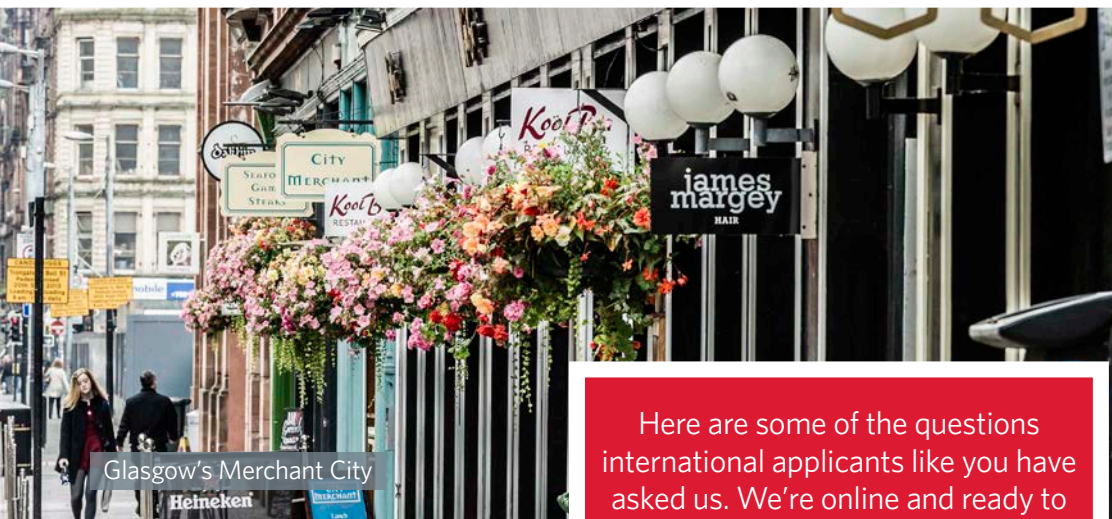
The earliest you can apply for a visa is three months before the start of your course. You'll normally get a decision on your visa within three weeks.

When you get your visa, it will be granted with conditions relating to your studies and life in the UK.

Graduating at GCU

① **What is the welcome for international students like?**

Our International Student Welcome Programme has been ranked number one in Scotland (ISB, 2019). With events and social activities throughout the year, you'll meet new people and get to know Scotland.

② **Will there be other students from my country?**

You will be among students from over 100 different countries here. You'll be part of an international and welcoming community of students from a wide range of backgrounds.

③ **Will I meet local students?**

With our global buddies programme you'll be matched with a student volunteer from Glasgow who shares your interests. They'll help you settle into life in Scotland.

If your offer depends on meeting minimum English language requirements, you'll be invited to enrol in our INTO Get Ready for English course. It's a free online course to practice and improve your skills before you arrive. You can also enrol on one of the pre-sessional English courses offered by INTO to prepare for living and learning in the UK. Search: INTO GCU

⑧ **Can I get help with my visa and immigration advice?**


Yes. We have a network of representatives around the world, who can help you with your application and the visa process - as well as a dedicated Visa Immigration Support and Advice (VISA) Team here on campus.

⑨ **What do other international students think about GCU?**

You'll be at a university that has been ranked first among the UK modern universities for living experience for international students (ISB, 2019) with a score of 92%. The same survey also asked international students to rate their happiness at GCU, with 96% saying they were happy here.

⑩ **Is Glasgow easy to get to?**

Yes. You can fly to Glasgow from almost anywhere. There is a major international airport within easy reach of the city campus. Rail services and the motorway network makes it easily accessible from the rest of the UK.

## Recognition of prior learning (RPL)

You may not meet the minimum academic requirements, but we understand that knowledge and skills can be acquired from a wide range of learning experiences, both formal and informal.

Our RPL scheme takes into account the wider picture. If you can demonstrate relevant work experience or have credits from recognised professional bodies, you may be qualified to enter the course you want. You may also be eligible for credits within your course.

RPL allows you to transfer credit gained from one course or institution to another. It also means you can use credit from a previously uncompleted course towards another.

The knowledge and skills you've gained through life and work experience, as well as, through non-certified learning, development and training can go towards your RPL.

## Mature students


As a mature student, you'll be able to bring a lot of valuable life and work experience to your studies. Adding a qualification to your experience can help you advance in your current career or help you move confidently into a new field.

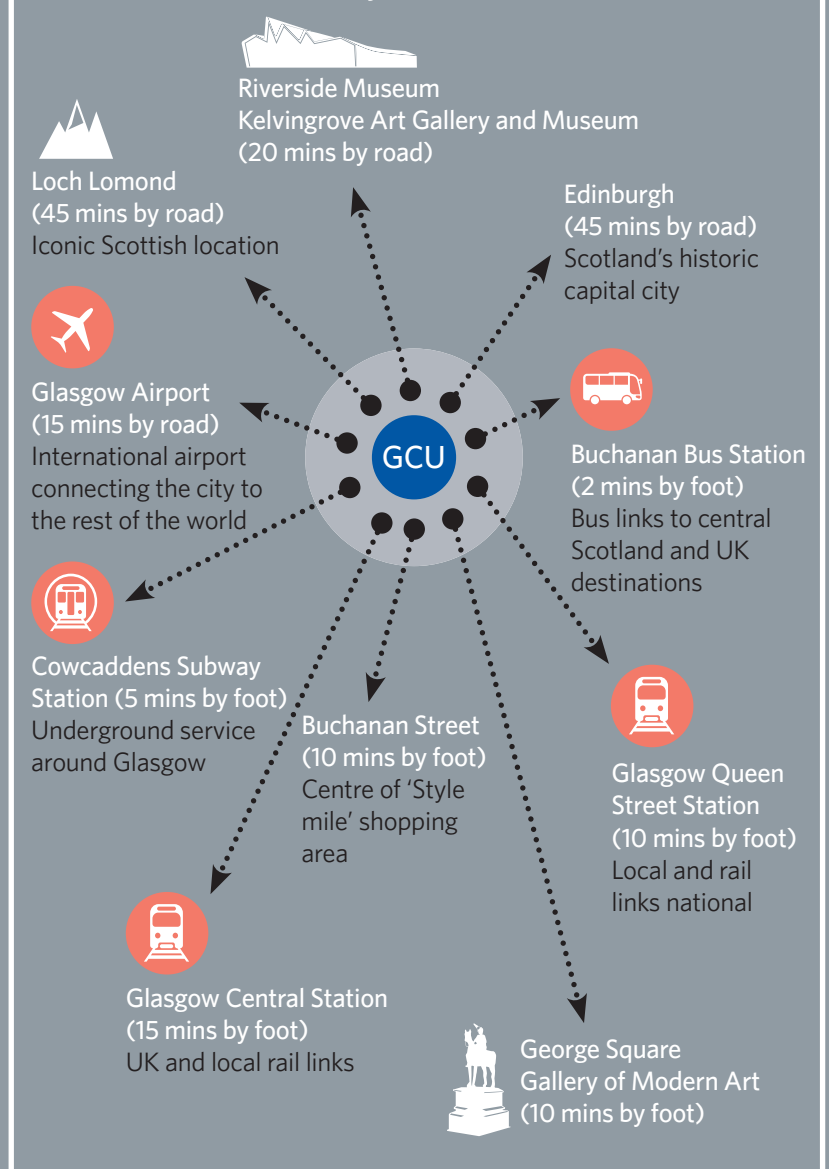

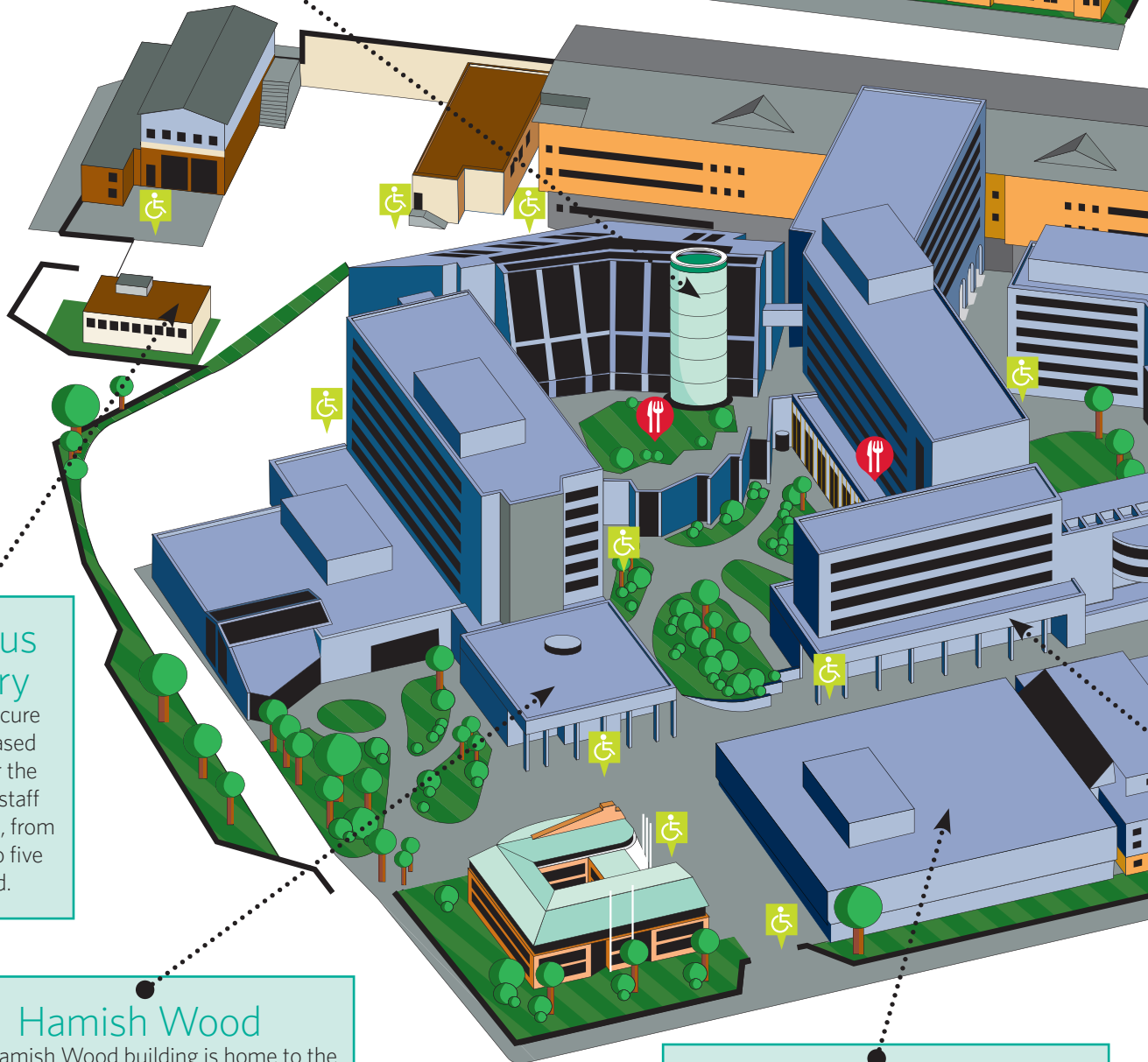
