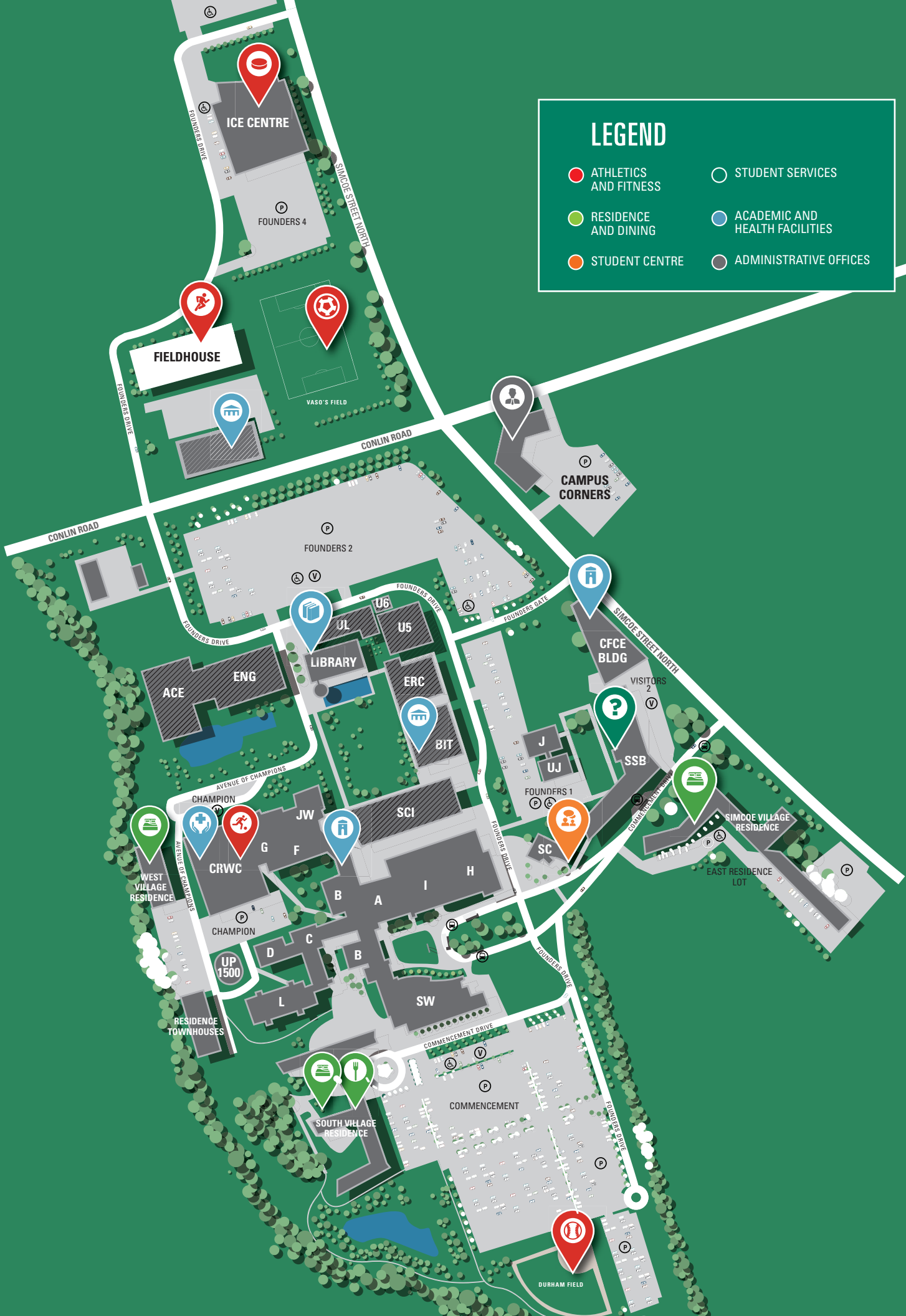

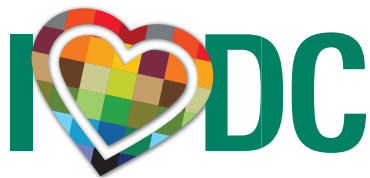

■ Graduate certificate and compressed fast-track programs:

Post-graduate programs designed for students with existing academic credentials and/or work experience to obtain qualifications in a reduced amount of time.

TYPES OF DURHAM COLLEGE CREDENTIALS

- DIPLOMA:** Study for two years (four semesters) and receive a diploma at the end of your studies. A diploma will allow you to enter the workforce in an entry-level position. **FAST-TRACKS:** Fast-track programs are designed specifically for applicants with past education and present a unique opportunity to complete diploma requirements in fewer semesters.
- ADVANCED DIPLOMA:** Study for three years (six semesters) and receive an advanced diploma at the end of your studies. You will receive an extra specialization in your third and final year of studies that will allow you to apply for a more managerial position. Most Advanced Diplomas have field placements at the end of the program. **FAST-TRACKS:** Fast-track programs are designed specifically for applicants with past education and present a unique opportunity to complete advanced diploma requirements in fewer semesters.
- GRADUATE CERTIFICATE:** Study for one year (two semesters) or one and a half years (3 semesters) and receive a graduate certificate at the end of your studies. Individuals who are interested in expanding on their previous post-secondary education qualify to apply for a graduate certificate program at Durham College. You will be able to study a program that complements your past education and therefore you will be able to seek a higher job position within your industry. Individuals with two to three years of in-field work experience may also qualify for a graduate certificate at Durham College.
- DEGREE:** Study for four years and receive a bachelor degree at the end of your studies. A fourteen week field placement is required. A bachelor degree, combining theory and practice, will allow graduates to enter the workforce and/or continue their studies at the graduate level.

CENTRE FOR FOOD (CFF)

The W. Galen Weston Centre for Food (CFF) is Durham Region's first-ever post-secondary presence focused on the field-to-fork concept, which is based on the harvesting, storing, processing, packaging, sale and consumption of food – in particular the production of local food for local consumers.

SCHOOL OF JUSTICE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

Programs in the School of Justice & Emergency Services address both the civil and enforcement aspects of the justice system, as well as emergency services professions. The school is comprised of approximately 1,500 full-time students supported by 150 full and part-time faculty and staff members. The school offers 12 undergraduate and six graduate programs, many of which offer bridging opportunities to university credentials. English Language Centre at Durham College

Located in the Greater Toronto Area at Durham College's Oshawa campus, the English Language Centre (ELC) operated by the University of Ontario Institute of Technology provides language pathways for students who meet the academic requirements for admission to Durham College but require additional English-language training. Qualified students will receive conditional admission to their Durham College diploma, degree or certificate program at the same time as they receive admission to the ELC.

Benefits of studying at the ELC:

- Six levels to develop the competencies needed for academic programs at Durham College.
- Out-of-class learning activities.
- English-only environment.
- Conversation groups, cultural and social activities, optional field trips and activities.
- Academic and cultural orientation week for all new students.
- Seven weeks (175 hours total) for each level.
- Twenty-five hours a week minimum.
- Classes with a maximum of 14 students.
- Six start dates offered every year.

You will be placed according to the results of the placement test performed at the ELC upon your arrival.

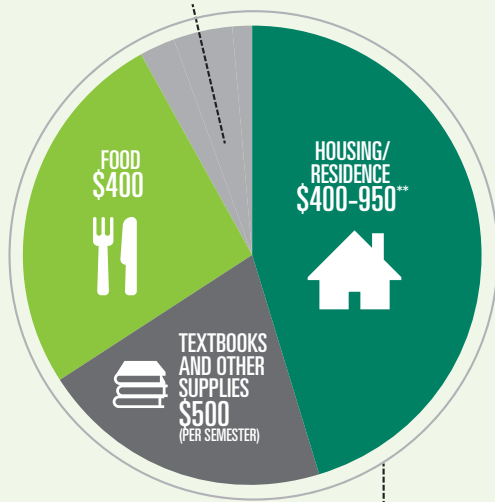

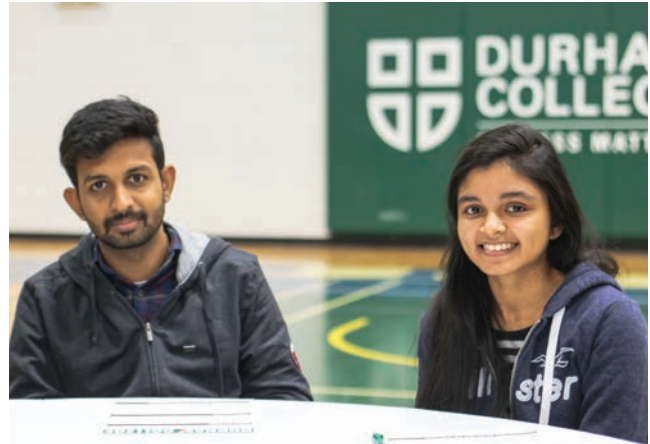

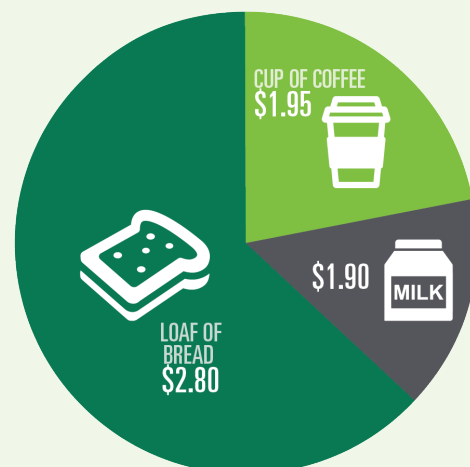

Students do not need to directly apply for a scholarship. Durham College staff will assess each student based on their English scores. Bachelor's degree students will also be assessed on their Grade 12 GPA (or equivalent). Successful recipients will be notified during their first semester by email. The funds will be applied to your account towards your second semester fees. Scholarships are non-renewable.

Co-operative Education (Co-op) office

Co-op is a model of education that integrates a student’s academic learning with workplace learning in fields relevant to the student’s academic and personal goals. Similar to an academic course, work terms are a mandatory component to this form of experiential learning. Services are available and supports are dedicated to co-op student success.

Co-op provides students in identified programs with the opportunity to gain paid work experience and apply in-class learning while exploring their chosen field through a planned sequence of academic semesters and at least one work term (this varies by program). Programs with co-op options require

prospective students to first apply to the regular program and once they become DC students, they may apply to transfer to the co-op option of their program during their first year of study. Enrolment in co-op is limited and the processes for securing a work term with an employer are competitive.

International students should note that by entering the co-op option of a program it may extend the overall duration of their program and therefore create the need for an amendment to their student visa which does have a cost attached. International students must meet with the International Education office to receive instruction and documentation to apply for a co-op work permit to ensure that their status in Canada is valid at all times.

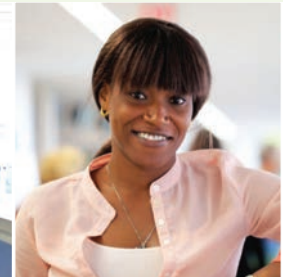

HOW TO APPLY

SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

In preparation of submitting your application, the following information and documents will be required:

- High school (secondary school) transcript.
- High school (secondary school) diploma.
- Post-secondary (college or university) transcript – if applicable.
- Post-secondary (college or university) degree – if applicable.
- Proof of English Language Proficiency (if required).
- Passport.
- Application Fee of \$100 CAD (non-refundable).

All documents are to be scanned and uploaded as part of the online application. It is important to save each document as a separate document (PDF or JPEG documents only; PDF preferred). If the document is several pages in length (university transcripts for example), save as a multi-page PDF when possible.

APPLICATION FEE

Payment of the \$100 CAD non-refundable application fee can be paid by credit card, Flywire or Western Union Business Solutions.

CHECK YOUR APPLICATION STATUS

Within five business days of submitting your application, you will receive login information to your self-serve application portal. This portal can be accessed at www.durhamcollege.ca/mycampus. On this portal, you can:

- View the status of your application to Durham College.
- Upload any documents which are still required.
- See a record of any admission letters and important email correspondence from Durham College International Admissions.
- Confirm your attendance at Durham College if you have received a Letter of Acceptance.
- Pay your tuition fee indicated in Box 25 on your Letter of Acceptance. Pay by Flywire, credit card or Western Union Business Solutions.
- View and print your official Durham College fee receipt once tuition fees are paid.

ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

If your application is successful, your letter of acceptance will be available to view and print from your self-serve application portal.

- Accept your offer by confirming through your portal.
- Pay your tuition fee, indicated on your Letter of Acceptance on page 2 in box 25, by the deadline date.
- Durham College will issue an official fee receipt once the confirmation and fee payment has been received. This fee receipt should be included with your study permit application.
- If you plan to live in an on-campus residence for January 2019 start, you must apply by Monday, October 1st.

PREPARE TO TRAVEL

In order to study at Durham College, international students will need to obtain a Canadian study permit, and in some cases, a temporary resident visa.

Apply for the necessary documentation from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and notify us at confirmationinternational@durhamcollege.ca once you have received your study permit confirmation.

Check your email for important information to prepare yourself for travel to Canada to begin your studies including:

- Important dates for new international students including the compulsory International Student Orientation.
- How to register for your timetable.
- Arrival services information (e.g. how to book airport pickup, temporary and long-term accommodation options, etc.).
- What to pack and bring with you to Canada.
