A majority of the UHSA faculty live on campus. Our faculty are both talented and committed, making themselves accessible after hours to ensure the success of our students. AT UHSA, YOU ARE MORE THAN JUST A NUMBER

UHSA prides itself on giving students individualized attention. Many of our faculty live on campus and are accessible to students. This allows for one-to-one attention even outside the classroom. Further, class size at UHSA is limited so as to promote a low student/professor ratio.

UHSA graduates have secured residencies in major healthcare and teaching facilities throughout the United States and are practicing across the globe in nearly every specialty, including surgery, obstetrics and gynecology, internal medicine, pediatrics, family medicine and anesthesiology. UHSA graduates can be found in private practice as well as practicing physicians in hospitals and medical centers and as department heads, faculty, chief residents, popular lecturers and researchers.

As one of the oldest private medical schools in the Caribbean, UHSA is listed with the Avicenna Directory of Medi-

cal Schools, formerly the World Health Organization (WHO). UHSA is also recognized by the Education Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG), the Antigua & Barbuda National Accreditation Board (ABNAB), and listed within the International Medical Education Directory (IMED).

This recognition confers eligibility for the medical graduates of the university to take the United States Medical Licensing Examinations (USMLE) in the U.S. and is one of the requirements of the Professional and Linguistic Assessments Board (PLAB) in the U.K. Our listing in the International Medical Education Directory (IMED-FAIM-ER) also allows our students to take the Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination (MCCQE). Nursing students are eligible to take the NCLEX examinations for licensure within the United States.

In 2015, UHSA filed for accreditation with the Caribbean Accreditation Authority for Education in Medicine and other Health Professions (CAAM-HP).

In collaboration with Georgetown University's student involved clinic, H.O.Y.A., the Free Clinic of English Harbour is a student-driven free clinic serving the population of English Harbour, Antigua.

The Free Clinic of English Harbour is managed by UHSA medical and nursing students and gives students an opportunity to contribute their clinical skills to a medically underserved patient population, while allowing students to directly experience the social, economic and cultural challenges that impact rural and island

healthcare delivery. Furthermore, students are given the opportunity to deepen their inter-professional leadership and organizational skills.




The M.D. Program is a 4-year program, separated into two semesters per year, with entry dates in January and August. The first two years are dedicated to completing the Basic Sciences on-campus in Antigua. Upon completion of the Basic Sciences, students complete a USMLE Preparation course prior to beginning the Clinical Sciences program at UHSA's affiliated teaching hospitals.

BSC LEADING TO M.D.

UHSA has formed partnerships with several outstanding institutions to offer combined programs that lead to an internationally accredited Medical Doctorate upon successful completion. These pathways present an opportunity to study for a fantastic medical career whilst experiencing a new country located in the heart of the Caribbean. This program is offered only to full-time undergraduate Biomedical Sciences students at London Metropolitan University and the University of Wolverhampton.

THIRD YEAR CLINICAL ROTATIONS

Third year core rotations consist of 48 weeks. This forms the foundation of the student's clinical education framework. The rotations are divided into two semesters.

During the fourth year, students must complete 30 weeks of electives.

Examples of electives include: Family Practice, Cardiology, Emergency Medicine, Neurology, Anesthesiology, Orthopedic Surgery, etc. The electives allow students to further explore their interests and diversity their medical education.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

JOIN THE UHSA FAMILY!

The application for admission is online and can be accessed at www.uhsa.ag.

A Bachelor of Science degree or 90 undergraduate level credit hours are required for admission. The coursework must include the following prerequisites:

General Biology with lab8 creditsGeneral or Inorganic Chemistry with lab8 creditsOrganic Chemistry with lab8 creditsGeneral Physics with lab8 creditsLevel Mathematics College level3 creditsEnglish6 credits

Applicants planning to practice in Puerto Rico are required to have the following prerequisites in addition to those mentioned above:

All required documents, if originally in a foreign language, must be accompanied by a notarized English translation. All transcripts documenting post-secondary coursework completed in institutions outside the United States or Canada must also be evaluated by an approved international credential evaluation service. Letters of Recommendation must also be in English.

The following documents should be submitted and sent directly to our USA Correspondence Office:

- Completed Application for Admission
- Official Transcripts of institution attended
- Two 2x2 photos
- Copy of Passport
- Two (2) letters of recommendation
- Non refundable admission fee of \$75.00 U.S.
- Copy of degree attained
- Personal Statement of no less than 400 words
- MCAT is required for all U.S. citizens and permanent residents applying for admission to the school of medicine.

MACEDONIA SCHOOL OF NURSING

The Macedonia School of Nursing is part of the campus of the University of Health Sciences Antigua. The School of Nursing has its own wing at UHSA and is comprised of spacious classrooms equipped with LCD projectors. There are also two simulation laboratories along with practice rooms and discussion areas. Faculty offices for the nursing department are also located in this area. As an added benefit, the nursing school has full access to the facilities of the medical school.

There are many reasons to choose the nursing profession. Registered nurses work to promote health, prevent disease and help patients cope with illness. They are advocates for patients, families and communities. In addition, countries all over the world are experiencing a nursing shortage. According to the US Department of Labor, employment for RN's is expected to grow faster than the average for all occupations. Finally, nursing is a well paid occupation with excellent job security.

The nursing program at the University of Health Sciences Antigua is a three year program leading to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing. The BSN program is patterned after the curriculum of U.S. nursing schools and the guidelines of the Caribbean Regional Nursing Board. Students receive excellent training from highly credentialed nursing and other faculty. Graduates can practice in the U.S. and Caribbean as well as other parts of the world. The entire program is spent in Antigua.

Students complete practical rotations at the Mount St. John Medical Centre and other government health care facilities in Antigua. Graduates of the program are eligible to take the NCLEX examination and the Regional Examination for Nurse Registration (RENR) in the Caribbean.

Caribbean Students are required to have five (5) G.C.E. O level passes or five (5) CXC general proficiency grades I, II or III to include English Language, Mathematics, Chemistry or Physics and Integrated Science or Biology and one general subject.

International Students are required to have their school send official transcripts of high school work including successful completion of English, Math and Chemistry with a minimum grade average of C.

We understand that pursuing your doctorate of medicine degree represents a major financial commitment for our students and their families.

UHSA provides you with the support and financial assistance that will make your medical education more affordable. Students accepted to the School of Medicine program will have the option of not only applying for private student loans, but may be eligible for other programs.

GUIDELINES OF THE STUDENT LOAN PROGRAM:

- Available only to eligible US Students and US Permanent Residents
- A credit report FICO score of at least 650
- Low, variable interest rate 7.5%
- Simple application process completed online
- No pre-payment penalties
- This program is designed to cover tuition, housing and expenses throughout the entire medical program

GOVERNMENT LOANS FOR CANADIAN STUDENTS:

- Loans recognized for the purposes of the Canada Student Loans Program
- Awarded through the Ministry of Education for each province.
- Canadian students are eligible for private loans through local banks such as Bank of Montreal, Royal Bank of Canada, and TD Canada Trust.
