General one-to-ones

Get the low-down on everything from admissions to accommodation and careers services. Speak to a member of the team in the Sports Hall, which is located in the David Fussey Building. The Students' Union stand is in The Dome. They will be there to answer your questions from 10am until 3pm. No need to book.

Tours and the local area

Campus tours

Set in a lush location in south-east London on the edge of Avery Hill Park, Avery Hill has a real campus uni vibe. With more than 1,200 students living here, it's a lively place to be. The Dome is the focal point for students looking to hang out or play a few games with friends. The campus's sports facilities include all-weather pitches, tennis courts and a five-court sports hall.

You can find out more about the campus by joining a guided tour led by one of our student ambassadors.

Accommodation tours

Many students living in the Student Village study at Avery Hill, but it's also a great location if you study at Greenwich. If you're living in one of our Avery Hill halls of residence, you can also park on campus if you buy a student resident permit.

Aragon, Boleyn and Seymour

Courts: flats for four or five students with single study bedrooms and shared kitchen and bathroom facilities. Maisonettes for six or seven students are also

Cleves, Howard, Parr and Tudor Courts: flats and maisonettes with single en-suite study bedrooms and shared kitchens. Most accommodation here is shared by six students, but flats in Tudor Court are larger and each flat offers space for nine students.

Explore Greenwich

Our Avery Hill campus is located in Eltham, in the Royal Borough of Greenwich. There are plenty of shops and restaurants and a new six-screen cinema opened in 2019. You can also use the intercampus bus and explore our Greenwich facilities.

We have a free intercampus bus service running throughout the day between our Avery Hill and Greenwich Campuses. Why not hop on board and discover our

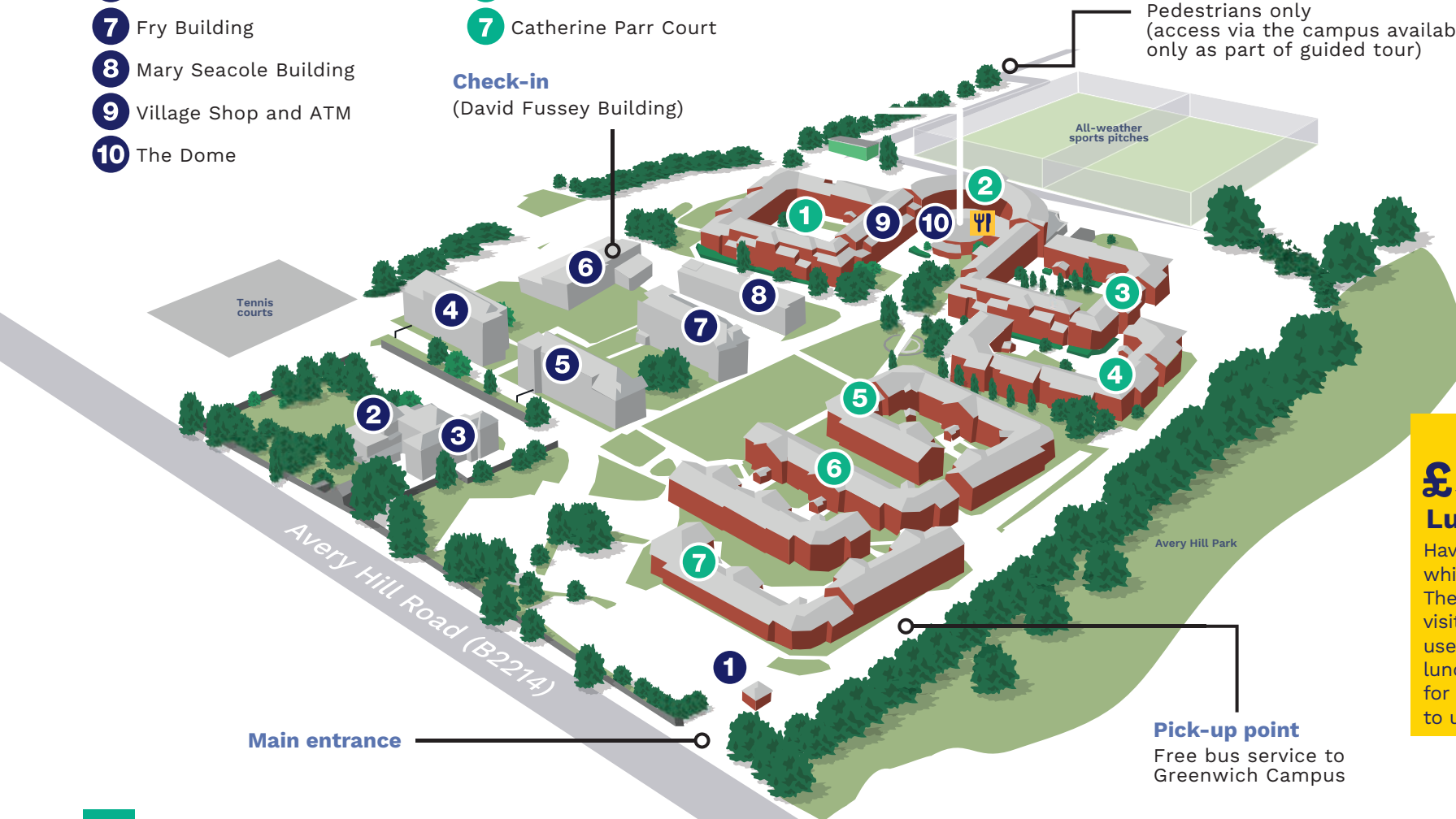
