

#### YOUR STUDY COULD BE FREE

All Level 1 and 2 programmes will be free in 2020 for New Zealand citizens, residents entitled to reside in New Zealand indefinitely, and refugees and protected persons (under the Immigration Act 2009), of all ages. Excludes First Aid certificate courses.

Fees Free: Free study for the first year of your Level 3 or above qualification may be available under the Government's fees-free study scheme. Visit feesfree.govt.nz for eligibility criteria and more information.

Youth Guarantee: Level 3 may be free for 16 to 19 year olds.

Proof of residency status required, entry criteria, and some costs may also apply. Free study is subject to funding confirmation.



You will gain the necessary critical skills and get the chance to work with patients in a range of healthcare settings and state-of-the-art clinical learning suite.

When you graduate, you'll be ready to sit the Nursing Council of New Zealand State Examination and apply for registration as an enrolled purse in New Zealand

- NCEA Level 2 (must include 12 Level 1 Mathematics credits), and evidence of literacy, numeracy and an ability to study at the appropriate level; or
- Relevant qualifications<sup>1</sup> or experience

### Entry requirements

Bachelor of Nursing, Bachelor of Nursing Maaori, and Bachelor of Nursing Pacific (Level 7).

#### Domestic students:

 Health declaration, current Police check, character references (x2), immune status and an interview may be required

- 14 NCEA Level 3 credits in each three approved subjects
- 10 NCEA Level 2 credits in Literacy (5 in each Reading/Writing)
- 10 NCEA Level 1 credits in Numeracy (achievement or unit standards 26623, 26626, 26627); and
- · 12 NQF Level 2 credits in Biology. Chemistry, Physics, Science

- · 80 NCEA Level 2 (40 at merit or excellence), including:
- 5 credits in each Reading and Writing (in English or Te Reo Maori); and
- 12 credits from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Science; and
- 10 NCEA Level 1 credits in Mathematics; and
- · An interview is required to determine your preparedness for tertiary study Or
- · Cambridge International Examinations; or International Baccalaureate (IB) equivalent;

### And

- · Have English language competence to undertake this programme which is taught and assessed in English (an assessment may be required if your first language is not English)
- If you have studied on a nursing programme at another institution you will be considered on a case-by case basis; or
- If you have completed the New Zealand Certificate and Study Preparation (Nursing Studies) (Level 4) achieving a B grade or higher in all subjects, you may be considered on an individual basis by the Head of School; or
- If you are able to demonstrate a mature approach to study; ability to pass a science diagnostic test; ability to manage your time; ability to seek support; a strong motivation to work in the health sector; ability to read and write at the level required for degree level study. These attributes will be assessed through an information session.

- 10 NCEA Level 2 credits in Numeracy (achievement standard or unit standards 26623, 26626, 26627)

#### Or

- 60 Level 4 credits in Social Science, Health Sciences or Education e.g. New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Level 4); or
- Relevant work or life experience<sup>1</sup>

#### And

 Applicants must have sufficient competence in the English language to undertake this programme which is taught and assessed in English.



Become a social worker. You will work with all kinds of people to get them the help they need.

Our Bachelor of Applied Social Work Te Torino (Level 7) will give you the skills you need to change peoples' lives for the better.

Our experienced tutors will guide you in how to work with different peoples, including Māori, New Zealand/European, Pasifika peoples and new immigrants.

In your fourth year of study, you will be ready to apply for registration as a social worker in New Zealand.

#### **Solution** Entry requirements

#### Domestic students:

- 19 years of age at start of the programme
  - Applicants below the age of 19 will be considered if they are employed, in a paid or voluntary capacity in a social service context and able to provide a current, written recommendation from their employer, or voluntary service provider demonstrating their suitability for the programme; or will reach the minimum 19 age requirement within one month of the commencement date of the programme.
- 42 NCEA Level 3 credits (14 credits in each of two approved subjects, plus 14 credits

from no more than two additional domains or approved subjects); and

• 8 Level 2 credits in English or Te Reo Māori (4 credits in each Reading/Writing)

- · Completed the MIT Certificate in Social Services (Level 4); or
- Completed a 60 credit certificate qualification (Level 4) in a field of practice relevant to social work; or
- 60 NZQA Level 5 credits, or equivalent; or
- Bachelor of Applied Social Work (BASW) Te Tōrino programme admissions panel may consider if you do not meet the academic requirements listed above, on a case-by-case basis and on the applicants own merit

- · Current Police check, full and unrestricted drivers licence, character references (x2), and attend an interview
- Demonstrate suitability to complete vocational social work degree level study



### 1. CHECK THAT YOU MEET THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Once you have decided on your programme, you will need to provide proof that you meet the entry requirements. Each programme has its own entry criteria based on academic achievements, qualifications and/or work experience.

What you already know and do can count towards a qualification with RPL (Recognition of Prior Learning). Contact us to find out more. Fees may apply.



### 2. APPLY TO STUDY
