


Disabilities and medical conditions




Student Village

You'll need to pay £300 advanced rent to reserve your room in our Student Village. This will be deducted from your first rent payment once you have moved in, and is not a damage deposit.

Loans and financial support

What you need to know

Universities charge you an amount each year to study with them. This is called a Tuition Fee. To be able to pay this fee each year, you will need to get a Tuition Fee Loan which covers this cost.

To be able to cover the cost of things like your rent, accommodation, food, travel and books for your course, you will need to apply for a Maintenance Loan each year.

Repayments

You will need to pay this money back, but only after you have finished your course and your income is over £25,000 a year. Any outstanding loan payments will be written off after 30 years!

Extra help

You might also be eligible for grants and allowances such as the Travel Grant and Disabled Students' Allowances (DSAs).

Full-time UK and EU undergraduate fees

We set our tuition fees annually for UK and EU undergraduate students in line with the UK government cap.

Our undergraduate fees for 2020-2021 have yet to be confirmed, but, as a guide, in January 2019 the fees for a course leading to a degree were £9,250 a year.


Part-time students

You can apply for a Tuition Fee Loan if you're studying more than a quarter of a full-time course each year (25% intensity). Your tuition fee is related to the intensity of your course e.g. If you study at 50% intensity you will pay half of the full-time tuition fee each year, but your course will last twice as long.
