



Bog Style (Kuehner, Abbott and Munster)



How to Apply

- 1 Visit www.ubishops.ca and click on the purple "Apply Now" button.
- 2 Complete the online application and pay the application fee.
- **3** Make sure you meet our minimum English Language Proficiency requirements and send necessary documents as required.
- **4** Submit unofficial transcripts and documents to the Admissions Office at admissions@ubishops.ca.
- **5** If you are not a Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident you will be required to obtain both a CAQ and Canadian Study Permit to study in Canada. Begin the process at **www.cic.gc.ca**.

Helpful hints:

Bishop's is Test Optional meaning we do not require supplemental test scores such as SAT or ACT.

Bishop's does not require letters of reference, essays or résumés at the time of application, however, some students may be asked to supply this information at a later date.

Students applying to the Music program require an audition.

Make sure to complete and submit ALL portions of the application. Only once your application is complete will we begin assessing your file.

Bishop's works on a rolling admission basis meaning we will begin assessing and making offers once a student's file is complete.

Apply early to avoid delays!

- Apply for On-Campus Residence by June 15, 2020
- Submit FINAL official transcripts and documents by September 15, 2020

Admission Criteria

In order to be eligible for undergraduate admission to Bishop's you must satisfy one of the following requirements:

- General Requirements: five senior-level (Grade 12 or equivalent) academic courses including English
- GPA requirement minimum score of 3.50 on a 4.00 scale
- Percentage grade requirement minimum grade of 80%
- R-Score requirement varies depending on program, see ubishops.ca/admissions for details
- IB requirement minimum score of 30
- French Bac requirement minimum score of 12.5
- British Curriculum requirements minimum five GCSEs with no grade below "C" on the old system, or "5" on the new system, and three A-levels with a minimum B/B/C score.
- Caribbean requirements minimum five CSEC subjects and CAPE certification with no grades below a "III"

English Language Proficiency Requirements

Applicants that have not studied in an English language curriculum must normally meet our English Language Proficiency (ELP) requirements (except students with a completed DEC from a Quebec CÉGEP). **Students must submit scores for only ONE** of the following standard ELP tests.

TOEFL: 90 (Internet based)

IELTS: 6.5

Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE) – Grade of C or higher Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE) – Grade of C or higher

CAEL: 70

International Baccalaureate (IB):

Language A1 or A2 (HL or SL) final score of 5 Language B (HL or SL) final score of 6

Language School Partners

For students who meet our minimum academic requirements but do not meet our ELP requirements, Bishop's may offer conditional admission to your intended academic program provided that you meet our ELP requirements through one of our Language School partners. For a list of partners and for more information please check the "English Language School Pathway Students" under the Future Students section of www.ubishops.ca.

CAQ and Study Permit Requirements

International students admitted to Bishop's University must obtain two study permit documents prior to arriving at Bishop's. Once students obtain their conditional or final letter of admission they can begin the application procedure. The first step is to complete a CAQ (Certificate of Acceptance) application with the Quebec government (www.immigration-quebec.gouv.qc.ca/en and click on Foreign Students). Once this permit has been approved students can then apply for a Canadian study permit (www.cic.gc.ca). It is important to note that the process can take anywhere from 4-16 weeks to complete so we encourage students to complete their application for admissions early to avoid any delays.

Study and Work in Canada

International students with valid study permits can work on or off campus a maximum of 20 hours per week and full time during holidays and summer months anywhere in Canada. Once they obtain their degree from Bishop's, international students are eligible to obtain a Post-Graduation Work Permit allowing you to work in Canada for up to three years. This valuable work experience helps graduates qualify for permanent residency in Canada and provides you with credentials that are recognized worldwide. Scholarships, Awards & Bursaries

Once students apply for admission and submit all necessary documents by March 1st they will automatically be considered for scholarship consideration – no supplemental applications are needed. Scholarships are based solely on academic merit and range in value from \$1,000 to \$20,000 CAD. Our scholarships are non-renewable, but students are automatically considered for scholarships every year while studying at Bishop's!

Students interested in our awards and bursaries need to submit a supplemental application and submit all other necessary documents. Awards are distributed based on academic merit and other criteria such as leadership and extracurricular activities. Bursaries are distributed based on academic merit and financial need.
