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Sheridan recently partnered with the Toronto Fringe Festival's Theatre Entrepreneurs' Networking and Training Program (TENT) to undertake a joint research project led by Professor of Creativity and Creative Thinking Dr. Brandon McFarlane. This collaborative, cross-disciplinary project enables Sheridan students from all programs to broaden their horizons, gaining hands-on work experience in the creative world of theatre arts.

THE TENT PROJECT

"My experience working with TENT has given me a confidence I never had before. I've made countless connections and have been introduced to an incredible support network." – Jackie Ferguson

When Jackie Ferguson (Honours Bachelor of Creative Writing & Publishing '21), Robyn Miller (Honours Bachelor of Creative Writing & Publishing '21) and Michael Rugo (Honours Bachelor of Interaction Design '19) enrolled at Sheridan, they never imagined they'd soon be spearheading a creative research project, but all three had vowed to never let an opportunity pass them by.

"I thought the TENT project would be an amazing way to collaborate and network with people both in and outside of my program," says Ferguson. "I've learned so much about the Fringe Festival and theatre arts, an industry that I wasn't too familiar with but have come to appreciate."

The Toronto Fringe Festival is Ontario's largest theatre festival, taking over the city of Toronto with more than 150 productions at over 30 venues every summer. TENT is a perfect fit with the Festival. The Sheridan initiative strives to connect emerging artists with established industry leaders to cultivate a new generation of knowledgeable, empowered and self-producing independent artists who are equipped with the necessary skills to thrive in the theatre world.

"This dynamic project allows for freedom and exploration of creative expression," adds Rugo. Students working with TENT have the opportunity to develop and hone their creative skill set through collaborative experiences, hands-on training and problem-solving workshops. In doing so, students are encouraged to step out of their comfort zones to express their creativity through avenues such as photography, videography, blogging, graphic design and social media.

Sheridan's Creative Campus is built on interdisciplinary exchange, collaboration and meaningful student learning opportunities. So when Sheridan officials wanted to create a mace for use at Convocation and other ceremonial events, they didn't have to look very far for design ideas.

A dozen teams from across each of Sheridan's campuses submitted proposals into a Student Design Competition, each with their own unique vision of how to communicate Sheridan's identity through an ornamental staff.

"Part of it was a learning process for students to come up with a final design, develop their concept, develop a model and finalize a finished product," says Dr. Catherine Hale, Director, Creative Campus. And as the mace is centre stage during high-profile events such as Convocation, Hale feels there's something special about having students be part of the process. Says Hale: "It's incredible to have the mace as a key component of our events, especially in those moments when we're celebrating student success."

The winning design — produced by second-year Honours Bachelor of Craft and Design students Erik Irwin and Alan Ngo as part of a class project — features an exterior of three bent oak wood panels flaring out at the top to symbolize Sheridan's blossoming future. The interior of the four-foot mace consists of pieces of 3D-printed plastic: rings representing each of Sheridan's Faculties and Schools, and a top segment representing Sheridan as a whole. Sheridan's distinctive 'S' is cut into the top of the mace, which is also subtly engraved with each Faculty's master pattern.

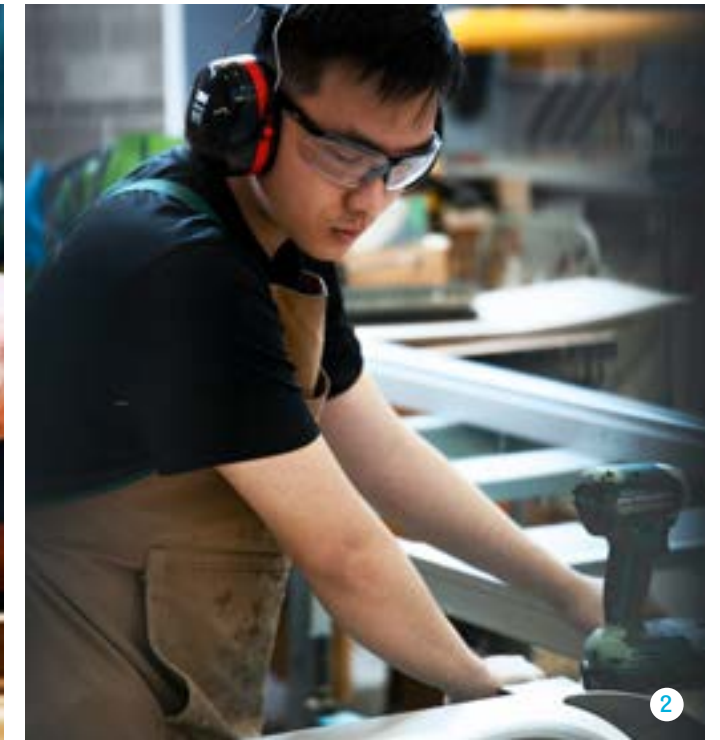
"When we designed it, we thought about its historical significance to Sheridan, rather than it being a project," Ngo says.

"It's really neat that Sheridan puts this kind of faith in their students and this confidence in our abilities as designers," adds Irwin. "It's humbling to think we're the ones that they picked."

Sheridan's District Energy Project has transformed the Davis and Trafalgar Road campuses into centralized energy hubs, providing heating and cooling onsite. Our District Energy Centres, which have the capacity to interconnect with and supply energy to surrounding communities, help Sheridan manage its energy efficiently. These advanced systems are a key component of Sheridan's Mission Zero strategy and ongoing commitment to sustainability.



DISTRICT ENERGY CENTRE

“We designed the District Energy Centre at the Davis Campus so it can be used as a living laboratory for students, who can use the equipment as part of their coursework. Students can engage with these state-of-the-art technologies while becoming leaders in energy efficiency and carbon mitigation.”

Through meaningful programs and relevant coursework, Sheridan has long prepared students for a complex world — one now increasingly faced with environmental challenges. Our District Energy Centre helps students face those challenges, by fostering an awareness of the effects of carbon emissions, landfill waste and the existing threats to biodiversity.

Equipped with glass walls and intelligent energy-use metrics, the sleek, European-style District Energy Centre at the Davis Campus is an interactive hub where practical learning and innovation come to life.

The Centre supplies both space and water heating through a robust, pre-insulated piping network equipped with integrated leak detection. Multiple low-temperature heating loops are separated from the high-temperature main loop through an energy transfer station. This station manages and measures the temperature and flow of each building's heating loop, reducing energy waste and increasing efficiency.

“Students can engage with the energy centres, experiencing the remarkable capacity of these systems firsthand,” explains Rinas. “Today's employers are seeking graduates with applied skills and knowledge of sustainable energy practices and renewable energy sources. These practices will help students solve the problems we face now and will face in the future.”

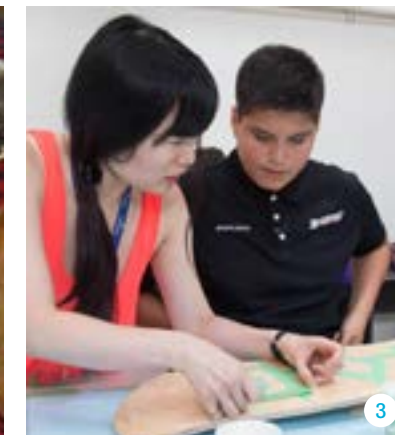

Students with an entrepreneurial spirit, innovative idea or side hustle might be enticed by Sheridan’s newest co-op option. Instead of heading out into the workforce to complete a co-op placement at an existing business, students can head to the Entrepreneurship Discovery and Growth Engine (EDGE) to create their own.

MAKING SPACE FOR NEW VENTURES

The opportunity is called Co-op on the EDGE and is hosted at EDGE’s headquarters at the Hazel McCallion Campus in Mississauga.

“In the EDGE environment, social enterprises and businesses can thrive,” says Chris-Beth Cowie, program coordinator for Co-op on the EDGE. “When clients are plugged in here, they get a 360-degree perspective of all aspects of start-up development.”

SUPPORTING STUDENT ENTREPRENEURS

Co-op on the EDGE students are required to dedicate 35 hours a week to their ventures, attend sessions on topics like market research and finessing a sales pitch, and participate in consultations with faculty mentors and industry guests.

Gursimar Anand, a current Honours Bachelor of Business Administration (Marketing Management) student, eagerly signed on to the program to help improve his Brampton-based retail store Celebration Season. “The experience has helped me plan out the best route for my business and taught me how to conduct the necessary research before implementing changes,” he says.

“Working with EDGE puts students in the driver’s seat,” adds Renee Devereaux, who leads EDGE as its director of entrepreneurship and changemaking. “We provide support and guidance, but they’re ultimately responsible for the success of their venture.”

Rather than participating in a traditional co-op experience, Cowie understands why students like Anand are drawn to Co-op on the EDGE. “Entrepreneurship is a way to establish something for yourself in the changing industry landscape,” she says. “The workforce doesn’t look the same way it did for our parents.”



Sheridan has a reputation for pioneering new technologies and programs. This spirit led to the creation of our Research and Incubation Centres, where students, industry, community, government and faculty collaborate to advance knowledge and solve problems.



APPLIED RESEARCH: PRACTICAL LEARNING

Sheridan is creating opportunities for you to work directly with our industry and community partners through curriculum-based and co-op research experiences.

These hands-on learning opportunities help you to gain practical, career-enhancing experience and contribute to how industries advance their work and sectors in our communities. It keeps your education in tune with the latest advancements in different sectors — and keeps you at the forefront of learning.

SOCIAL INNOVATION AT SHERIDAN

The Centre for Mobile Innovation (CMI) is one of Sheridan's Research and Incubation Centres and is focused on mobile health. CMI creates innovative solutions in the areas of the Internet of Things, wearable computing, augmented/virtual reality, and/or machine learning. CMI has been at the forefront of promising projects, from Augmented Reality apps using the Microsoft HoloLens for nurses and doctors, to mobile-friendly medical assessment kits for low-resource settings to detect pneumonia in children. The research model in the CMI engages students, faculty, and industry and community partners to create lasting impacts in mobile health.

BRAMPTON

Davis Campus

Our Davis Campus is named after the founder of the Ontario college system, former premier William G. Davis.

Located in Brampton, one of Ontario's fastest-growing cities, the Davis Campus is home to our applied health, community services, engineering and technology programs. In 2017, the campus opened its new Skilled Trades Centre — a three-storey, 130,000-square-foot facility designed to provide an optimal learning experience for our students, with dedicated workshops for plumbing, electrician, machining, industrial mechanic millwright, welding and construction skills.

The Davis Campus is home to the Centre for Advanced Manufacturing and Design Technologies (CAMDT), a 40,000-square-foot flexible innovation space for students, manufacturers and industry partners to explore highly specialized manufacturing and design equipment, from robotics to 3D printing.

The campus also features a three-storey library and learning commons with open spaces for collaboration.

MISSISSAUGA

Hazel McCallion Campus

Bright and welcoming, the Hazel McCallion Campus (HMC) embodies Sheridan's Creative Campus philosophy and commitment to sustainability. Its features include a creativity commons where students can mingle and collaborate; a public Gallery showcasing the creativity of the Sheridan community; and the Institute for Creativity. The building also houses the Material ConneXion Library, an extensive collection of future-forward materials specifically curated for Sheridan students to inspire design ideas or provide solutions to challenges.

Programs offered in the building include a grouping related to sustainable built environments, including Architectural Technology, Interior Design and Interior Decorating. Programs in Advertising, Marketing and Visual Merchandising complement the business diploma, degree and graduate certificate programs that have been offered at HMC since its opening in 2011.

Construction is currently underway for a new Student Centre. It will feature a range of amenities and athletic facilities, including student lounges, food outlets, fitness rooms and an elevated indoor running track.

Trafalgar is home to the Faculty of Animation, Arts & Design, Canada's largest arts school, with over 6,000 students. The on-campus gallery is a showcase for student and faculty work, while the hallways boast a constantly renewed exhibition of student creativity. Theatre Sheridan, with two performance theatres, stages several acclaimed productions every year. The campus is also home to the Canadian Music Theatre Project, an incubator for new musicals which earned renown as the starting point for the Tony Award-winning musical *Come From Away*.

A number of programs from our Faculty of Applied Science and Technology, and the Faculty of Applied Health and Community Studies, are located at Trafalgar. Sheridan's Centre for Indigenous Learning and Support is also located here. As well, the campus offers a state-of-the-art sports field for our varsity Bruins soccer and rugby teams.

BRAMPTON: BEAUTY INSIDE AND OUT

Brampton is fast becoming known as a creative and cultural hub in the Greater Toronto Area. Young and diverse, Brampton boasts 175 ethnic backgrounds and a great mix of restaurants, boutiques and festivals. With plenty of lakes and parks, and 267 km of trails, there are also hundreds of reasons to get outside.

MISSISSAUGA: LAKESIDE LIVING

Canada's sixth-largest city is also one of its most intriguing. Located on the shores of Lake Ontario, Mississauga offers marinas, parklands and trails for all kinds of outdoor fun. It's also a great place for arts, with galleries like the Gallery for Emerging Young Artists. Other highlights include free concerts in Celebration Square and the Festival of Cultures, which is the largest multicultural festival in Ontario.

Each of the rentable bikes comes equipped with a basket and a lock. And unlike many other bike rental programs, it's free to full-time students and employees. What's more, you're able to keep it for up to a week to truly experience life with a bike.

SUSTAINABILITY AT SHERIDAN

Sheridan is committed to integrating sustainability into all aspects of teaching, learning, energy, waste and operations. We reduced our waste to landfill by 50% in 2017–18 compared to 2013–14, the year before Zero Waste stations were introduced across our campuses. We're aiming to become a Zero Waste campus by 2030.

A HUB OF ACTIVITY

With the support of the Region of Peel, the Sheridan Bike Hub opened its doors in the fall of 2018 at our Hazel McCallion Campus in Mississauga. It's a do-it-yourself bicycle repair shop, the destination for bike rentals and home to a mentorship program that connects new and seasoned cyclists.

Transportation is a focus of Sheridan's Mission Zero efforts led by the Office for Sustainability, and the Hub is another way to educate the Sheridan community about environmentally friendly travel options.

BENEFITS OF THE BIKE

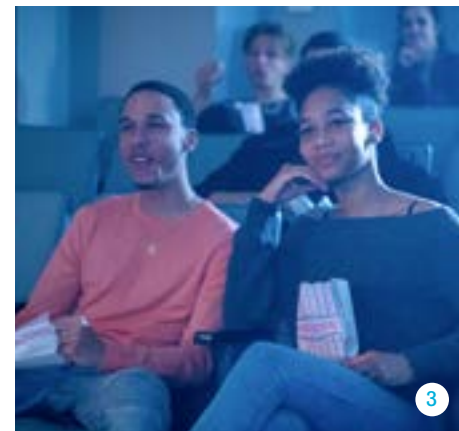

WELLNESS

LIBRARY AND LEARNING SERVICES

Library and Learning Services offers research help for students and professors, either in person or via chat, email or phone.

Sheridan's libraries feature extensive resources including e-resources (e.g. full-text databases of books, newspaper and magazine articles, and online catalogues, as well as special multimedia-based information sources and streaming video) accessible through the library website.

In addition, our libraries provide academic support in the classroom. Our librarians facilitate workshops on the topics of effective research, e-resources and citation. The library also administers the institutional repository, called SOURCE, a place for accessing and even contributing to scholarly research and creative activities created by the Sheridan community.

Along with a variety of study spaces (collaborative, group study and quiet space), the library and learning commons features the Tutoring Centre, the Academic Integrity Office, assistive technology rooms and IT support.

TUTORING CENTRES

Tutoring is available at all campuses through Library and Learning Services. Students can book an appointment with a tutor through an online booking system.

Learning Assistants provide tutoring to Sheridan students at no additional cost in a variety of subjects, such as English, math, architecture, interior design and decorating, accounting, finance, computer programming, chemistry, and more. Assistants are co-op students who work in the Tutoring Centres on each campus.

Practice in conversation skills, basic computing skills and presentation skills is also available in a group setting.

Peer-Assisted Learning (PAL) leaders are available in a variety of first-year courses too. PAL leaders are Sheridan students who are recommended by faculty and who help other students review notes, discuss readings, develop study skills, and prepare for tests and assignments.

Peer tutors offer course-specific tutoring in subjects outside of those provided by the Learning Assistants. Peer tutors are Sheridan students who earn a grade of 76% or higher in the course they tutor in, and are referred by professors.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY OFFICE

Applicants to our programs come from high school, other college and university programs, or the workforce. Requirements for admission differ between each individual program. ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

Instruction at Sheridan is in English. To be successful in a program, your English communication, listening, comprehension, reading and writing skills must be at a level sufficient to meet the demands of postsecondary or graduate certificate study. All applicants to Sheridan must demonstrate competency in English and may be required to complete English testing. Visit our website to view required tests and minimum test scores.

MATURE STUDENTS

A mature student is an individual who doesn't possess a secondary school diploma or equivalent, and is 19 years of age or older before the start date of the program.

Mature students who apply to Sheridan's certificate and diploma programs must demonstrate their ability to work at the postsecondary level in one of two ways:

- By successfully completing equivalency testing in English and/or mathematics and/or required courses, *or*
- By completing an academic upgrading program at a level appropriate to the program of choice.

Mature students must demonstrate proficiency in meeting specific program prerequisites.

Mature applicants to degree programs must complete or have completed two semesters of postsecondary education, including specific course, GPA and additional admission requirements.

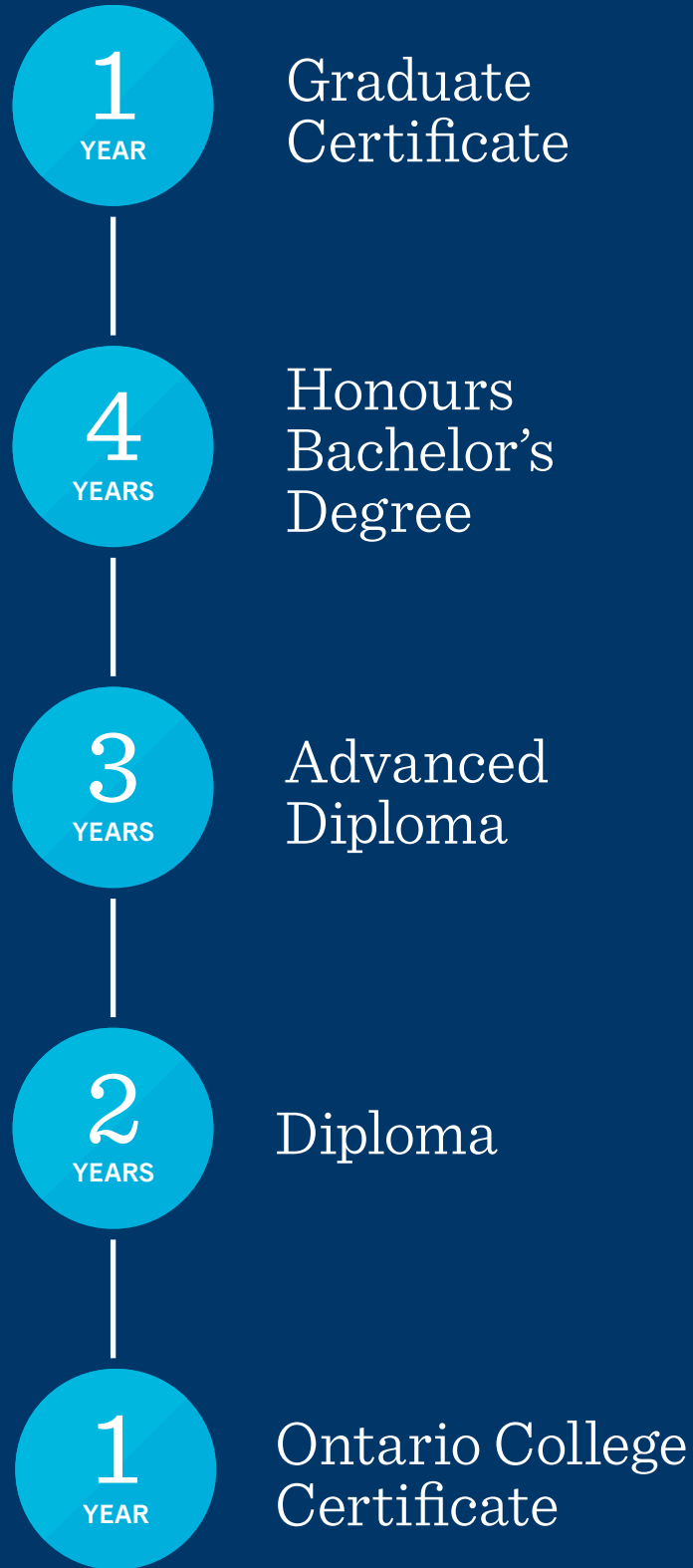

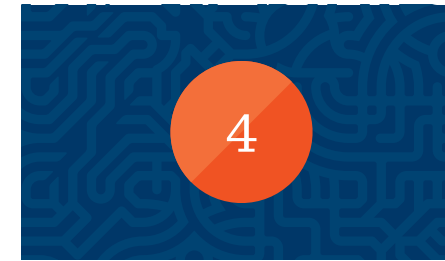
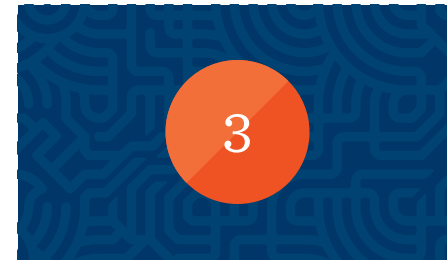

INTERNATIONAL CREDENTIAL EVALUATION

If you're a domestic applicant who attended any educational institution outside of Canada, your credentials require comprehensive (course by course) assessment by either World Education Services (WES) or International Credential Assessment Service (ICAS) Canada; evaluation fees will apply.

A copy of your completed evaluation must be sent directly to ontariocolleges.ca. Please allow sufficient time for these assessments to reach Sheridan. Refer to the ICAS and WES websites for additional information.

IF YOU'RE AN INTERNATIONAL APPLICANT

Submit your documentation

IF YOU'RE CURRENTLY ENROLLED IN HIGH SCHOOL

Advise your guidance office that you're applying to Sheridan. They'll send ontariocolleges.ca a record of your grades (also known as transcripts).

IF YOU'RE NOT CURRENTLY IN HIGH SCHOOL

Arrange to have official copies of your transcripts sent to ontariocolleges.ca, including evaluated international credentials.

If you're over 19 years of age before the start date of your program and don't have a secondary school diploma or equivalent, you may be asked to write a Mature Student Equivalency Test and/or provide any transcripts you may have to ontariocolleges.ca

If you've earned your High School Equivalency Certificate by completing the GED (General Educational Development Certificate), arrange to have the official copy of your GED transcript sent to ontariocolleges.ca. Sheridan considers applications for admission from students who are home-schooled and satisfy the program-specific academic achievement requirements. For details, please contact our Admissions Office.

Accept your offer

Please be sure to meet all deadlines for accepting your offer and paying your fees. Admission decisions for the September term will be issued as early as February 1, 2020. Offers of admission to programs with additional admission requirements (e.g. portfolios, auditions, résumés, etc.) are issued later in March. Ensure you accept your offer of admission by the due date specified on your ontariocolleges.ca account, or you may lose your offer. Sheridan will be advised of this decision. Once we receive your acceptance to our offer of admission, we'll post an estimate for your program fees online in *myStudent Centre*.

International applicants must also apply to Citizenship and Immigration Canada for a study permit. Please refer to Sheridan's International Centre web pages at studyatsheridan.ca for more detailed information.

Education is an investment in your future. If a shortage of funds is impeding your attendance, we can help you secure funding. Every year we administer \$7.3 million in work-study earnings, scholarships, awards and bursaries, in addition to government assistance.

GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE

The **Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP)** is a government-sponsored program designed to help students fund their education. OSAP entitlements are determined based on specific financial circumstances.

OSAP CHANGES

In early 2019, the Ontario Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities announced that there would be some changes to OSAP effective for the 2019–20 academic year. To help you understand what these changes mean and how they may impact you, here are some updates.

INTEREST-FREE GRACE PERIOD

The six-month loan repayment grace period remains unchanged. During the first six months following the discontinuation of full-time studies (i.e. finishing a program or dropping courses below a full-time course load), students are not required to make any loan payments.

During this time, however, students will accrue interest on the provincial portion of their student loans.

CHANGES TO GRANT ELIGIBILITY

All OSAP applicants will receive a minimum of 10% of their funding in the form of a student loan. (However, students can still continue to select the 'grant only' option on their OSAP application to avoid any debt.) The percentage of funding that will be a loan will depend on several factors, including the **student's income** (and, if applicable, their family's income) and the **student's status** (dependent, single independent, married/common-law, sole support parent).

Students whose families have a household income of \$140,000 or more will no longer be eligible for the Ontario Student Grant (compared with household income of \$175,000 or more in 2018–19).

CHANGE IN THE DEFINITION OF 'INDEPENDENT STUDENT'

Independent students will now be defined as those who have been out of high school for six years (compared to four years in 2018–19). This means that students will continue to report their parents' income on their OSAP application if they have been out of high school for six years or less.

CHANGES TO EXPECTED STUDENT, FAMILY AND SPOUSAL CONTRIBUTIONS

The purpose of OSAP is to supplement a student's contribution to their educational costs. The amount that students will be expected to contribute will increase from \$3,000 to \$3,600 for 2019–20. This expected contribution is automatically calculated into students' OSAP assessments. The expected family and spousal contributions (if applicable) will increase in 2019–20, which may impact students' OSAP assessments differently as compared to previous years.

COMPULSORY FEES

For the 2018–19 academic year, the OSAP assessment included service, administration and education-related fees charged by Sheridan and paid by the student. In 2019–20, the OSAP assessment will only include the mandatory fees related to the campus-wide services all students must pay.

SHERIDAN WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS

To help offset the cost of your education, Sheridan offers on-campus employment through two **work-study programs**. Students attending full-time studies may be eligible for part-time employment. If you're on a co-op work term or between academic terms, you may be eligible for a full-time position.

FINANCING YOUR EDUCATION

To keep your spending under control, it helps to develop a budget for the year.

When making your budget, please take into account the following — and don't forget to include the potential costs specific to your program.

\$5,000–\$14,000 per year

Residence and housing
\$7,000–\$7,500 per year

Food and living expenses
\$1,200–\$2,300 per year

Books and supplies
\$1,500–\$2,500 per year

Tips

- 1 Apply for OSAP right after you've accepted your offer of admission to Sheridan. It can take 4–6 weeks for your OSAP application to process.
- 2 If you're offered credit card deals, be careful. It's easy to spend too much on credit, and difficult to pay off.
- 3 If you apply for OSAP assistance, your fees will be deferred (postponed) until receipt of your funds; you only need to pay a \$500 deposit up front when your fees are due.
- 4 Stick to your budget. This will ensure your money will last through the year and help you avoid a financial crisis.
- 5 If you're having financial trouble, please come in and talk to us. We can help you budget and control your costs.
- 6 Apply for all the scholarships, awards and bursaries for which you're eligible. The online awards application is open for the first four weeks of classes in each semester. Students who complete the application will be considered in Sheridan's 'auto-match' process to receive a Sheridan Bursary.

Scholarships, awards and bursaries

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Sheridan provides more than \$7 million in financial assistance to eligible students who demonstrate financial need. When students complete the online awards application each semester, their application will be considered for those Sheridan bursaries that are 'auto-matched.'

AUTO-MATCHING

This means that an online awards application is automatically reviewed against the eligibility criteria for a Sheridan bursary to determine the amount of institutional funding that the recipient will receive. There's no need for the student to complete an additional application.
