All our programs align with in-demand occupations in Manitoba and throughout Canada.

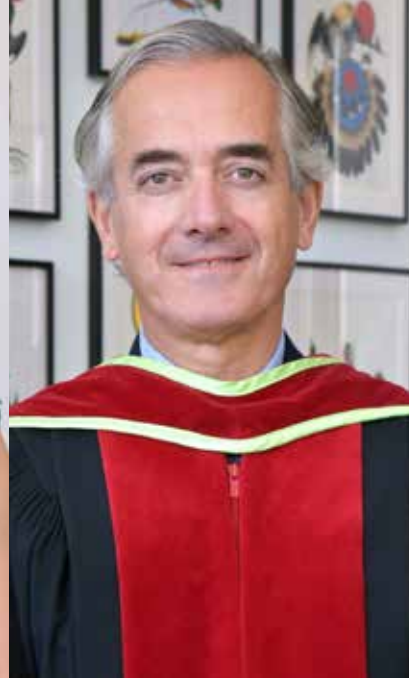
STUDENT FOCUSED
