Getting to Buckingham

By train

Take a 30-minute fast train from London to Milton Keynes. From there, you can catch a bus from outside the station to Buckingham High Street: we are only a five-minute walk from here. Bus services depart every 30 minutes and operate every day.

By road

We are in the centre of Buckingham, and our three main sites are all within one mile of each other (at Hunter Street, Chandos Road and Verney Park). Buckingham is easily accessed via the UK motorway network.

Students can enjoy free on-site parking across the campus at any time.

BUCKINGHAM CAMPUS

Our Buckingham Campus runs across three sites: Hunter Street, Chandos Road and Verney Park.

Hunter Street is our main site and this is where you can find the Students' Union building, bar and restaurant, and other student facilities. We also have plenty of study spaces: from quiet areas in the Hunter Street Library to group working areas in the Vinson Building.

Chandos Road, which houses our Medical School, is adjacent to the main campus and contains teaching, studying and academic spaces for our medics.

Our Verney Park site is just a 15-minute walk from Hunter Street. If you are based at Verney, all of your course materials will be located onsite at the Franciscan Library or can be found online.

CREWE CAMPUS

Crewe, close to both Liverpool and Manchester, is home to a range of allied health courses, including medicine (also taught in Buckingham), podiatry, biomedical science and postgraduate medicine. Our new Health Sciences Campus is well connected to the nearby town of Crewe, with a bus service running regularly to the centre and train station. The student accommodation is just a five-minute walk from your lecture theatres.



THE

TWO-YEAR DEGREE

As the home of the two-year degree, Buckingham offers the widest range of courses in the two-year format. We also offer two intakes a year: in January and September. We first introduced two-year degrees in the UK in the 1970s and have been perfecting them ever since. Our two-year degree is a condensed version of the traditional three-year degree, meaning you will gain a full honours degree (like your friends at other universities), but graduate a whole year earlier.

Even better: you can save money as well as time. Although our annual fee is higher than that of other universities, you will save a whole year's tuition fees and living costs.

HOW DOES A TWO-YEAR DEGREE WORK?

We created our twovear degrees by adding an extra term in each summer. This means vou can fit in the same number of teaching weeks as a traditional three-year degree without your workload aetting anv bigger. You could even choose to continue onto a master's programme, finishing both an undergraduate and a master's degree in only three years.

WILL IT SAVE ME MONEY?

Buckingham's fasttracked schedule means you'll finish your degree sooner and be out in the workforce up to a vear earlier than if you went to another university. When living costs are included, our students pay about 20 per cent less than they would on a three-year course at a university charging £9,250pa for tuition. And don't forget: you could enjoy a full vear of extra earnings while your friends are still studying!

STUDENTS' UNION

CLUBS AND SOCIETIES

Buckingham may be small, but the University has a growing range of sports teams you can join: including rugby, netball. hockey, football, badminton and basketball. Our Sports' Union also connects with professional sports teams to broaden the range of sporting opportunities available to students, including university and college sports teams and competitions. We also have a gym on campus that's open till midnight seven days a week.

TOWN LIFE

Located beside a thriving market town, Buckingham offers more than 15 places to grab a drink; a range of shops and independent cafes; and loads of restaurants to choose from, including Turkish, Thai, Italian, Indian, pub grub, and even a smokehouse.

Market days are every Tuesday and Saturday, which take over Market Hill and the High Street, and the town is only a five-minute walk from campus.

OUT AND ABOUT

Venture further afield to Milton Keynes (20 minutes' away) for a dose of high street shopping, indoor skiing, gokarting, indoor skydiving or the cinema. From MK, you can hop on a fast train to London (30 minutes' away), Birmingham, Edinburgh, and beyond.



A new set of Flexible Honours programmes were launched in 2020, allowing you to tailor your degree, and these complement the wide selection of single and combined honours courses available.




Make your degree as unique as you.

LAW

Ranked in the top 20 in the UK¹, the Law School prides itself on two key features: strong student satisfaction and employability outcomes. Through small-group tutorial teaching, our experienced academic staff will ensure that you build the knowledge you need to take the first step in your legal career.

Our Law School provides evidence- and research-based learning to equip you to address the critical legal issues of today and tomorrow. An LLB will enable you to take the next steps towards practice qualifications in a number of common law jurisdictions, including the UK, Nigeria, Canada, Bermuda, Ghana, Kenya, Bahamas, Pakistan and India. You can also combine your Law degree with Business Management or Criminology to broaden your career options.

Our LLB courses are all qualifying law degrees (QLD), which is currently recognised as fulfilling the academic stage of training for entry into both branches of the legal profession by the Solicitors Regulation Authority and the Bar Standards Board. From September 2021 a new route to qualifying as a solicitor is planned, called the Solicitors' Qualifying Examination (SQE). Our LLB will keep up to date with this change.

Our LLB is also available through part-time study, which involves attending a seminar one evening a week: you can earn a law degree alongside other commitments, graduating in just four years.

We also offer postgraduate Law (LLM) degrees, so you can graduate with a master's in just three years (boosting your earning potential on average by £6,000² more per year).

We offer January and September intakes for most of our courses. All Law courses are taught on the Buckingham Campus.

MEDICINE & HEALTH

Our Schools of Medicine and Allied Health provide professional healthcare training based at both the Buckingham and Crewe Campuses. The University's aim is to put the student first. We do this by being small enough for our students to be an individual in a supportive community, and large enough to provide all the experience you need to progress your medical career.

Our integrated 4.5 year MB ChB programme is GMC-accredited and designed to ensure you develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to become a professional and ethical doctor.

Direct entry to the 4.5 year MB ChB programme is possible at school-leaver and graduate level. However, we also offer a range of pathways to Medicine.

The Medical Foundation, one-year Pre-Med and two-year BSc Biomedical Science courses are available as potential pathways to Medicine (see the table on p68). We are also launching the BSc Podiatric Medicine on the Crewe Campus from 2020. As a podiatrist, you can work as an independent clinician who identifies and analyses complex health problems linked to the foot and lower limbs. The course offers wide ranging career opportunities in the NHS or as a future business owner in private practice.

We offer January and September intakes for most of our courses, however, the MB ChB is only available for a January start. We accept applications throughout the year.

Medicine is taught on both the Buckingham and Crewe Campuses, whilst Allied Health courses (including pathways to Medicine) are taught only on the Crewe Campus. MB ChB applicants have a choice of which Campus they prefer* (see buckingham.ac.uk/medicine).



PSYCHOLOGY

Understanding people will be central to the future world of employment; their thoughts, behaviour and motivations. The Psychology degree at Buckingham is designed to help you develop the knowledge and skills for a career focused on people.

The award-winning Buckingham teaching model focuses upon weekly meetings with tutors on every module which means you have quality contact time with the staff. You can ask questions, check that you are on track with assignments, and interact with the staff who are teaching you. This is one of the reasons why we have come top in England for Student Satisfaction four years in a row (*The Complete University Guide, 2017-2020*).

The Psychology degree at Buckingham is designed so that you can try out the seven areas of practitioner psychology as standalone optional modules or mix these with other options on our programme. You will have a choice with your final year project to either carry out a research project within one of our research hubs or to choose a subject of your own.

As one of the only two-year BPS-accredited Psychology degrees in the UK, you'll be able to fast track your career within this popular field. You can also combine your degree with a variety of subjects, including a new Criminology minor from 2020.

If you apply direct, you will need to return your completed Acceptance Statement by the deadline stated on your offer letter. To accept your offer via UCAS, you need to go to Track to make your replies. Deadlines will be visible in Track.

Writing your personal statement can be daunting, so here are some handy tips to help get you started.

- If you apply direct to Buckingham, you can **tailor your personal statement** just for us. If you apply through UCAS, your personal statement needs to be relevant for all of your UCAS choices, so don't be too specific and avoid using university names.
- 2 Make sure you **give yourself plenty of time** to write your personal statement. It takes longer than you think.
- Start mapping out the structure of your statement to make sure you cover everything. A good start can be:

Part 1: Why do you want to study this course? Show evidence of motivation and commitment; leadership, teamwork and communication; and any evidence of research into the subject.

Part 2: What skills/experience do you have that will make you suitable?

Part 3: Why will you be a good student?

- **Avoid embellishing or plagiarising** it's very easy to get caught!
- Once you've drafted your personal statement, have a family member or friend read it. This is great for proofreading but also to make sure that you are coming across well in your writing.



Two-year degrees at Buckingham not only mean you can graduate a whole year earlier, but they are cost effective too. You can save at least £10,000 by studying with us. When living costs are included, our students pay around 20 per cent less than they would on a three-year course at a university charging the standard £9,250pa for tuition. And the best part is: you can graduate with less student debt!

FEES & FINANCE

Managing your own budget can be a tricky prospect, especially if you're leaving home for the first time. We're here to support you on your journey and provide any information or advice you may need.

TUITION FEES

Your tuition fees cover the cost of studying with us at the University of Buckingham. Fees may vary by course and whether you are a UK or international student. You can find the individual course fees on our website: just look up the course you wish to study. **buckingham.ac.uk/courses**

GOVERNMENT LOANS

Most UK and EU undergraduates will be eligible to receive a tuition fee loan from the government. Income-tested maintenance loans are also available to help with expenses like accommodation, food and bills. Finance for international students is more complicated as loans are available only to students who have lived in the UK for at least three years prior to starting their course. FEE GAP

While you will save money with a two-year degree, there can be a fee gap at Buckingham between our tuition fees and the funds you can access through government loans (ie, the tuition fee loan and the maintenance loan). This will depend on the course you choose and the level of maintenance loan you are eligible for. In most cases there will be a fee gap which you will be required to pay to the University on a termly basis (in four instalments each year). This means you will need an additional source of funding. 
WORKING WHILE STUDYING

There are a broad range of part-time job opportunities for students both on the University campus and in the wider Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire areas (from cafés, restaurants, retail stores and National Trust properties, to the luxury shopping outlet Bicester Village). Our careers staff can help you find and apply for jobs. Undergraduate-level international students on a Tier 4 visa are currently permitted by law to work a maximum of 20 hours each week during term time, with no limit during vacations.

SAVE ON ESSENTIALS

All students can apply for a National Union of Students (NUS) card, which provides proof of student status and offers discounts of up to 50 per cent on technology, food shopping, eating out, going out, media subscriptions, clothes, travel and university supplies. There are separate cards and programmes that offer a wide range of student discounts, such as UNIDAYS and Student Beans.

As a socially responsible university, we're fully committed to attracting and supporting the very best students. A wide range of scholarships, in addition to the University of Buckingham Bursary, are available for students to apply for. These can be awarded based on location, merit or financial need. Examples include:

THE HIGH ACHIEVER SCHOLARSHIP

£2,000 awarded in your first year of study if you achieve AAB or equivalent A-level results.

THE UNIVERSITY OF BUCKINGHAM BURSARY

£2,000 per year, available to UK and EU students (linked to household income).

There are also a range of subject-specific scholarships on offer.

Bursaries and scholarships are awards from the University of Buckingham that you do not need to repay. Many scholarships have firm application deadlines.

Substantial postgraduate discounts are also available to students wanting to further their studies. These include a 33 per cent discount if you have a first-class honours degree recognised to UK standard; and a 25 per cent discount for Buckingham graduates with a 2:1 undergraduate degree progressing on to a postgraduate course.
