Admission Requirements

Our trained admissions staff members evaluate your credentials and determine whether you are the right academic fit for Duquesne.

We are looking for students who fit Duquesne's motto of an Education for the Mind, Heart and Spirit.

Applying to Duquesne

To apply to Duquesne, please submit the following:

- Application form** – online or downloadable at www.duq.edu
- Original or attested copies of official academic records** from at least the last 4 years of education
- At least one letter of recommendation** from a teacher or mentor
- Standardized tests (SAT/ACT)** – SATs are generally not required for international applicants; however, some specific programs will request an SAT score from international students. The Office of International Programs will notify you of these requirements.
- Personal statement about yourself** of at least 300 words, which answers the following questions: What is unique about you? Why have you chosen this major? How will Duquesne help you to achieve your academic, personal and professional goals?
- Certification of Finances** that will allow you to receive a student visa to study at Duquesne. The Office of International Programs will be able to assist you with this part of the process once you have applied to Duquesne.

Please note that video interviews are sometimes requested once your application is under review.

Scholarships

International Student Libermann Scholarship: This scholarship is awarded based on past academic performance demonstrating how Duquesne is the "right fit" for you. The amount awarded varies from \$5,000 - \$15,000 per year. You are automatically evaluated for this scholarship if your application is received before April 1.

Athletic Scholarship: As a Division I University, Duquesne offers highly competitive athletic scholarships to athletically talented students.

Music Scholarship: Students applying to the School of Music are reviewed for these scholarships if they have submitted their academic application and music audition by February 10. The awards are based on the successful completion of the audition, theory and musicianship exams.
