We require all international undergraduate applicants to have a minimum of IELTS 6.0 (including 5.5 in academic writing) or equivalent. There are some courses which require higher IELTS and this will be clearly indicated in their entry requirements. We offer foundation and short pre-sessional programmes to improve your English language skills prior to your chosen undergraduate studies, as well as in-sessional support alongside your main course of study. Submit your application via ucas.com to study at Winchester (don't forget about the 15 January UCAS deadline).

We review your application. For some courses, you might be asked to attend an interview.

3. OFFER

We hope to offer you a place at Winchester.

4. CHOOSE

Once you make us your first choice, you can begin your journey at Winchester:

- Apply for University housing by 31 March 2021 to be in with a chance to win free accommodation for your first year. If you are a full-time first year undergraduate student, we guarantee you accommodation (please note application deadlines do apply)
- You may be eligible for additional financial support through our wide range of awards and bursaries
- If you are predicted top grades, we may be able to make you an unconditional offer and you may be eligible for our Highflier Academic Achievement Award
- Chat to a current student about life at Winchester before you arrive
- Join our 'Find Your Tribe' Facebook group, so you can meet other students starting in 2021

5. CONFIRM

We will confirm your place when we receive your results.

Whether you're interested in how the political system works, exploring African-American cultural heritage, or enriching your love of American films and literature, these courses have it covered. Explore key issues and debates about culture, race and gender which have shaped the United States and, if you prefer, follow a specialist route in politics, literature, film or history.

partner universities in America for a semester or a year. Our optional field trip in Year 2 or Civil Rights Pilgrimage to the American South in Year 3 make for gripping shorter visits.

You will gain the knowledge to understand and evaluate the cross-cultural diversity of the United States, and skills of analysis, debate and presentation that will contribute significantly to your employment prospects.

animal welfare

Positively contribute to the advancement of animal welfare and bring about a better world.

One of the University's core values is Compassion – for people, animals and the planet. Our Animal Welfare and Society course encourages you to explore relationships between humans and other animals, and examine what animal welfare means today. The broad scope and thought-provoking content enables you to discover and develop your areas of interest.

You will investigate critical questions such as what are our responsibilities to animals; why do we develop emotional attachments to animals; why does society make gods of some animals but vilify others; and what can we learn about human nature by studying animals?

Critically review major theories, philosophies and contemporary problems as you study a range of animal welfare issues through disciplines from ethics and law, to policy and the environment, to animal advocacy and representation.

Through internships and other work placement opportunities you will be able to experience working with animals and/or organisations associated with animal issues.

Through the lens of social anthropology, biological anthropology and archaeology/material culture, you will embark on a fascinating exploration of human behaviours and societies across the past and present. Modules draw on archaeological evidence, the long-term perspective of human evolution and present-day examples from societies around the world.

You can get up close and hands-on with a range of materials, from primate skeletons to religious relics in our cutting-edge departmental laboratory. You also have the opportunity to undertake a work placement in Year 3 and participate in rewarding field research

locally or further afield with academics working in locations like Barbados, Georgia or other established projects worldwide.

As an anthropology student, you learn how to understand, interpret and respond to human behaviour.

These courses will develop your intercultural understanding which is a key asset in today's international job market. Our graduates work in a wide range of careers such as international development, government and business.

You will learn from world-leading archaeology scholars in a stimulating and engaging environment. We offer you the perfect blend of academic study with hands-on, practical fieldwork where you can use innovative scientific techniques, the latest range of field equipment and our fully equipped laboratory. You will have access to specialist computer software such as ArcGIS and Geoplot.

Our department has a commercial research consultancy

(ARCA) which offers valuable laboratory work experience – an opportunity to combine your academic expertise with delivering high-quality commercial solutions.

As well as working on fieldwork sites in the UK, previous students have been to Barbados, Corsica, Georgia, Belgium and Greece – and one of our courses includes a full year's professional placement: Archaeological Practice with Professional Placement, BSc (Hons).

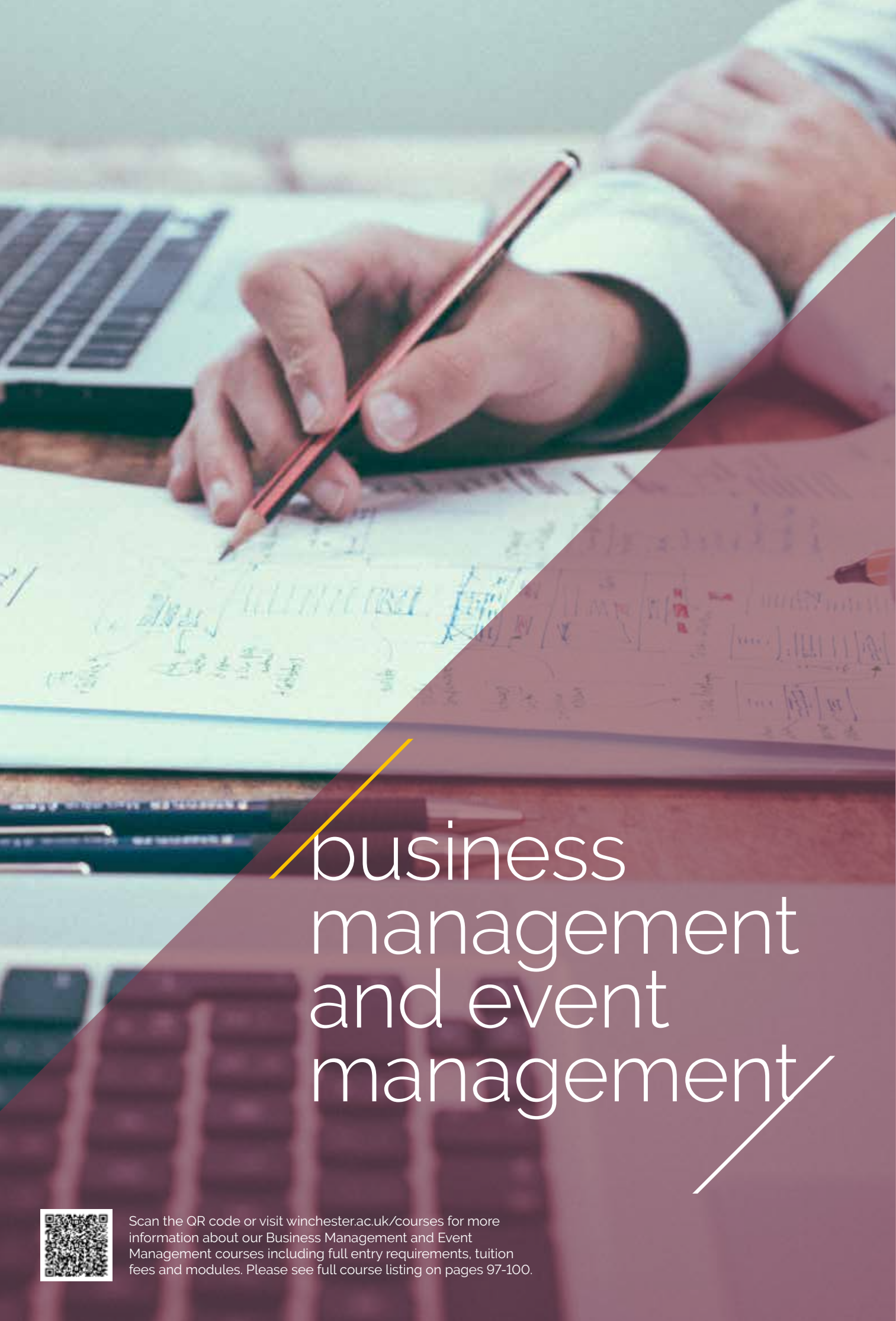

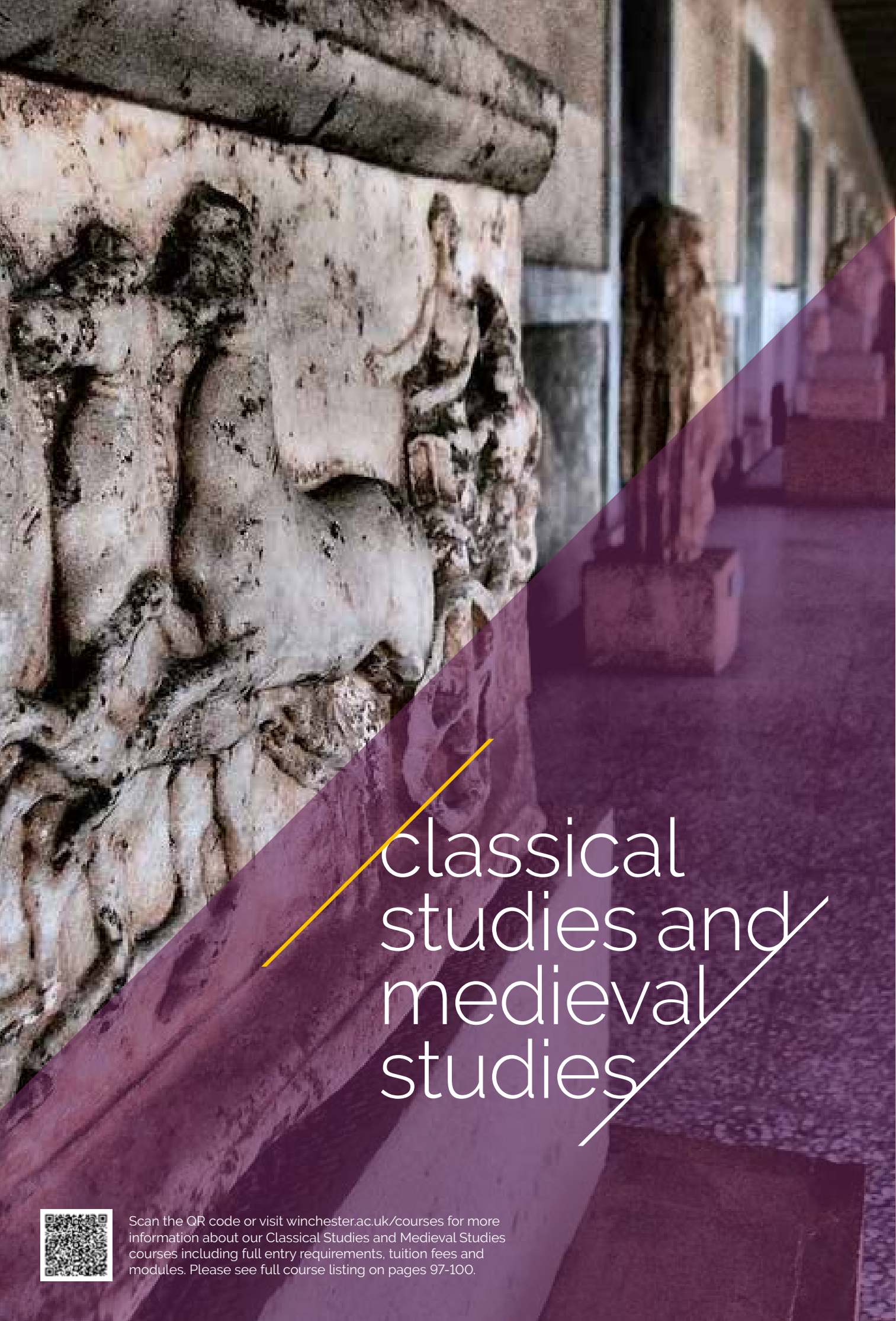

classical studies and medieval studies

Where the ancient, classical and medieval past gives you a keen lens through which to see our modern world.

Gain a critical yet empathetic perspective of different views and develop deep theoretical and cultural knowledge sought after by employers in many industries.

Our Ancient, Classical and Medieval Studies course takes you on an engaging adventure through time. From the Bronze Age to the Crusades and beyond, it's an absorbing journey exploring the archaeology, history, art and religion of human settlements in the British Isles, Europe, the Mediterranean and the Atlantic. This course has a multidisciplinary approach to the human past, led by expert faculty from archaeology and history.

Meanwhile, our Classical Studies course delves

specifically into the rich heritage of the ancient Greek and Roman worlds. Explore fascinating cultural and intellectual history on this course which blends together the study of history, literature, drama, philosophy, archaeology, art and architecture. The course contextualises and enriches the study of these disciplines through theoretical, research and vocational elements. You investigate the world of the Greeks and the Romans in both historical and contemporary contexts and so come to a new understanding of the world.

Both courses also offer opportunities for placements, trips or study abroad.

We require all international undergraduate applicants to have a minimum of IELTS 6.0 (including 5.5 in academic writing) or equivalent. We offer foundation and short pre-sessional programmes to improve your English ability prior to arrival, as well as in-session support alongside your main course of study, if you wish to improve your English language skills. 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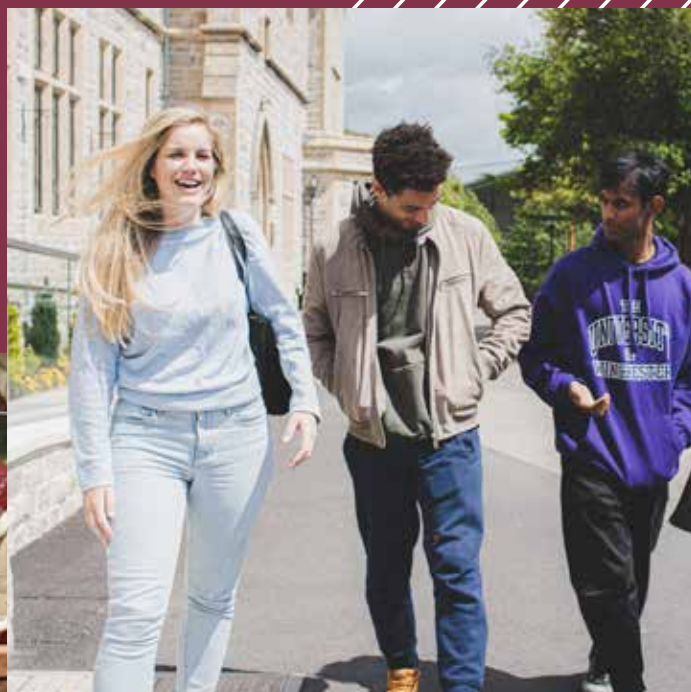
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
