

By studying in the UK before Sixth Form, students have the time to adjust and develop the necessary language and study skills required to excel in their future studies.









ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT AND SUPPORT

An academically rigorous and enriching experience

We want our students to achieve their ambitions and broaden their horizons, ready to take their place in the world as global citizens and future leaders. The academic enrichment and support that we provide helps students reach their full potential.

Theory of Research, Active Citizenship and Knowledge (TRACK) programme

Developed in-house and exclusive to d'Overbroeck's International School, our TRACK programme supports students to develop a global mindset, along with the key skills they need to excel in their IGCSE, A-Level and higher education studies.

The programme is made up of three key modules:



Research

Students learn how to conduct effective research, analyse academic sources and think critically.



Knowledge

Students learn how to critically examine different sources of knowledge and how this impacts shared experience and different cultural perspectives.



Active Citizenship

Developing students as global citizens who really care about the world around them, this module is mainly project-based and allows students to support their local community in their home country and in Oxford. Last year, one of these projects involved a reverse advent calendar: a collection of presents which were donated to a local homeless shelter in Oxford.

Higher Project Qualification (HPQ) Level 1 or 2

Available as an additional qualification for students to study as part of our 4 or 5-term, One or Two-Year IGCSE courses, the Level 2 HPQ is recognised as the equivalent of a full GCSE qualification.

The HPQ requires students to study a topic area which expands their learning in an appropriate area of study. This helps them to develop key skills required for success at A-Level, IB and university such as:

- ✓ Independent study
- Critical thinking
- ✓ Academic research
- ✓ Active learning
- ✓ IT literacy

Some of our students' recent HPQ projects include NASA's colonisation of space and artificial intelligence in medical care.

Wider Learning Days

Our Wider Learning Days are a great way for students to develop their team-working, research and presentation skills through group project work. Students take part in project challenges with pupils from other classes with whom they don't usually work, responding to a brief by problem-solving and presenting their strategic thinking. Some recent Wider Learning Day projects have included designing a two-week package holiday and writing and dramatising a letter from a World War I soldier.



Subject clinics

Whilst our courses are academically demanding, our teachers are always on hand to support students with their studies. Academic support is available in small groups or on a one-to-one basis. Each week we offer clinics for every subject we teach, enabling students to ask questions and get help on any areas they are struggling with.

Form Tutors

Form Tutors are important contacts for students during their time with us. Every student is allocated a Form Tutor who offers pastoral care support and works closely with them on their academic progress and achieving their ambitions.

Pre-sessional course

Students who might not meet our entry requirements may be able to join our pre-sessional course over the summer prior to the start of term. The course includes additional support for students to help improve their English proficiency and study skills.

LIFE AT THE INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

An international school full of energy, fun and enthusiasm



Daily life at The International School is fuelled by enthusiasm, laughter and a strong sense of community. We want our students to be curious, brave, caring, fair, respectful, happy and healthy, and these six learner attributes feature throughout our lessons, assemblies and awards.

The school year

We study for three terms each school year – September to December, January to March and April to early July – with a short break in the middle of each term.

Our busy school calendar is packed with exciting events and visits to take part in, from inter-House competitions to Wider Learning Days, our International Arts Festival to visits to famous museums, galleries and UK cities.

Our House system

Like other British boarding schools, our
House system ensures our students'
time with us is as fun and enjoyable
as possible. Within the school, every
student belongs to one of three
'Houses': Cooper, Morris or Austin.
Each year these Houses compete
to win the House cup.

Good work, helpfulness, achievements, being a role model for other students, embodying our learner



attributes and other contributions to the life of the school win students points for their House. There are also plenty of opportunities to take part in inter-House competitions and other activities to earn more points.

Student leadership

There are a range of leadership opportunities for students to develop their skills. In addition to our House Captains and Vice-Captains, other roles include being a member of school council or our events committee.

Form Tutor time

Every morning students meet with their Form Tutor and Tutor Group for 10 minutes before lessons begin. This is a useful opportunity for students to review their progress and personal wellbeing with their tutor, to find out about upcoming events and celebrate achievements.



Assemblies

Our weekly assemblies are led by senior members of staff or external speakers with a focus on key topics and current affairs, broadening students' awareness and understanding. Every three weeks our House Captains also run specific assemblies for their Houses.

Lessons

Lessons at d'Overbroeck's usually take place in 45-minute periods, with some double periods. All students will have physical education lessons each week to keep fit and healthy.



Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) lessons

Students spend 45 minutes each week focusing on their personal development. Topics are tailored specifically to the needs of international students and include: dealing with culture shock, improving inter-cultural communication, safety, managing personal finances and health and wellbeing.



Music, Art, Drama, Sport and Activities

After school and every Thursday morning, we have an extensive variety of sports options, performing arts opportunities and activities to choose from. Many of these also involve our British students from our Years 7-11 school and Sixth Form and are a great way to make new friends.



Weekend leisure opportunities

Every Saturday and Sunday, our international students have brunch and dinner with our Sixth Form students and can take part in one activity or trip each day. Particular favourites include baking, sports competitions, punting down the River Cherwell as well as trips to London and Bath for the Christmas markets.

PASTORAL CARE

Pastoral care underpins everything we do


At d'Overbroeck's, the health and welfare of our students is always a number one priority from the moment a student chooses to study with us.

Pre-arrival preparations

From the very beginning we help our students to settle into their new school community and life in Oxford. Our incoming international students receive regular communications from the school to help them prepare for their arrival in the UK, to find out more about our school community and local area. We ask new students to take part in our online New Student Transition programme to explore their subjects and academic programmes in more detail, and to meet other students before they arrive.

Our induction programme

Once students arrive in Oxford they embark on an induction programme, introducing them to life at the school, key members of staff and the local area. This programme has been specifically designed to support international students, including personal activities such as registering at our local doctors' surgery and how to open a UK bank account. It's also a great way for students to make friends and settle into their new home.





Supporting our students

Whilst at d'Overbroeck's, students have access to various support options to meet their needs. If a student becomes unwell, they are cared for by our School Nurse in our medical room and can receive treatment at our local doctors' surgery. In any rare case of serious illness, Oxford has some of the best hospitals in the world.

Students meet with their Form Tutors on a daily basis to discuss their wellbeing and are supported by Mikaela Parker, our Deputy Head, who is responsible for pastoral care at the school. School Counsellors are also available for appointments with students to discuss any worries or concerns.

Mental health awareness and maintaining a healthy wellbeing also form key parts of our Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) curriculum and personal development lessons. Topics include dealing with cultural shock, managing personal finances and health and wellbeing.


