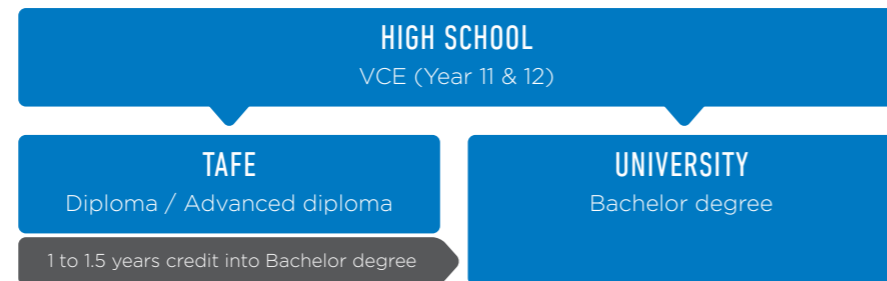

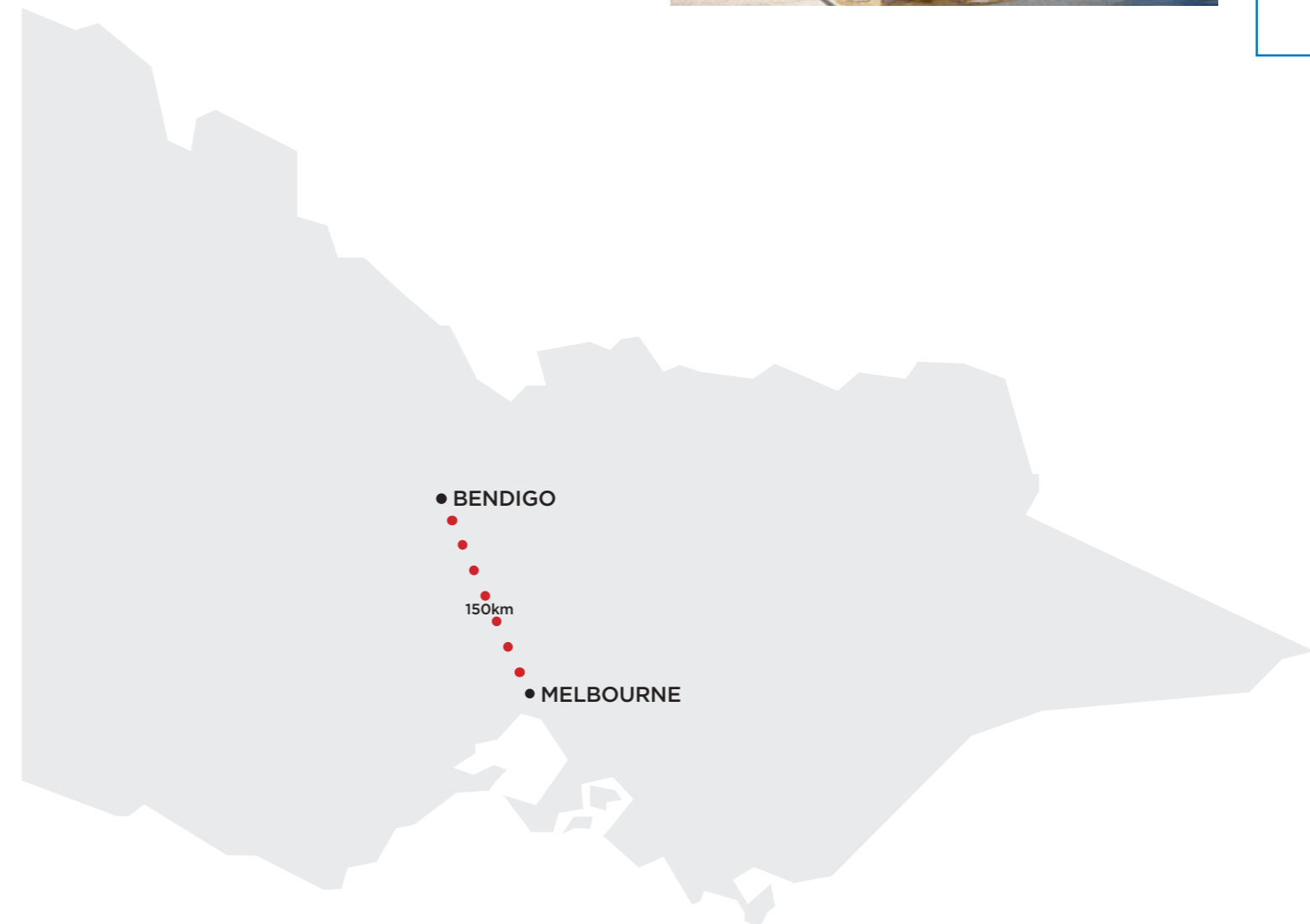


BENDIGO CITY

All international students are required by the Australian Government to take out health cover. The Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) provides international students with free public hospital care for non elective treatment and an 85% rebate of the standard doctor's fees.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Kangan Institute offers a wide range of courses from English language programs to internationally recognised certificates, diplomas and advanced diplomas.

The academic year usually commences in February and finishes in December. The year is divided into two semesters and four terms. All courses offered commence in February and some have additional intakes throughout the year. Classes are scheduled between 8am and 6.30pm. Some classes may require students to attend in the evening and on weekends.

STUDENT WORKING GROUP

This is a group of students and staff who meet once a month and acts as a channel of communication, partnership and consultation between students and staff at Kangan Institute and Bendigo TAFE.

All scholarship applicants must meet Kangan Institute entry requirements, in addition to any eligibility requirements of the scholarship.

TUITION FEES AND REFUNDS

Tuition fees are payable prior to the commencement of each term. Repeat subjects will attract additional fee per student contact hour.

TUITION FEE DUE DATES

Semester 1: 14 January - 15 April
Semester 2: 15 June - 15 September

Tuition fees do not cover the cost of books, equipment, personal stationery, uniforms or excursions unless otherwise stated. Estimated book and equipment costs are detailed in individual course listings.

All enrolled students will be required to pay the Kangan Institute and Bendigo TAFE annual student amenities fee of AUD\$200.

Refunds are payable in accordance with In order to process a refund, Kangan Institute or Bendigo TAFE must have received the cleared funds and you must not have any outstanding debts. A refund will only be paid to the student or to the person nominated in the Acceptance Agreement Declaration.

Except in instances of provider default where no Application for Refund is required, a refund request must be made on the International Student Refund Form.

STUDENT VISA REGULATIONS

As an international student in Australia, you must meet the conditions of your visa throughout your entire study. These conditions must be stringently adhered to.

In order to meet your visa conditions you must:

- be enrolled in a full-time, registered program*
- complete your study within the time shown on your confirmation of enrolment
- meet the financial requirements to cover your living costs (and costs for any dependants) during your study
- arrange education for your children aged 6-17 years if you have children who are accompanying you to Australia (international research students can send their children to a public school without paying any tuition fees)
- maintain satisfactory academic progress to avoid exclusion from your course.

*International students can only enrol in VU-registered programs that are listed on the Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS).

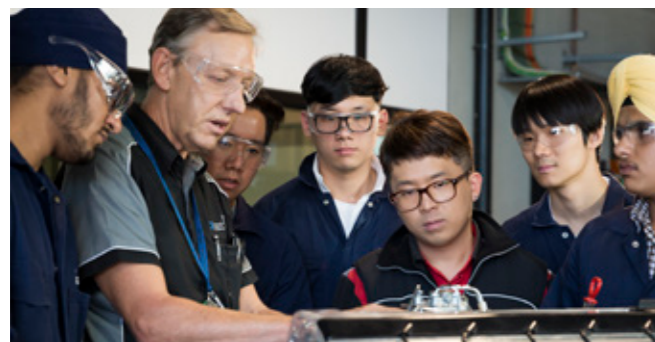
Diploma to degree pathways are a great way to obtain practical training before entering your chosen degree course and a great option for students who do not meet the entry requirements of the degree course. Students who successfully complete a diploma or advanced diploma may be eligible for 1 to 1.5 years credit in a related degree at any university.

At Kangan Institute's ELICOS Centre we love to combine technology, fun and knowledge to foster and develop the learner's natural curiosity and provide space for them to express themselves in their new language.

HOW TO APPLY

All courses have prerequisites that must be met by all applicants. It is important that you check the prerequisites for your course before you apply.

Subject credits may be awarded to students who can supply evidence of successful completion of previous studies. These must be provided along with your application.

Kangan Institute does not charge an initial application fee. We will be the single point of contact for all your queries and will respond quickly when processing your application. Applications can be submitted directly to International Department (by mail, email or in person) or through an authorised **education agent**.

1. SELECT YOUR COURSE (S)

Select the course(s) in which you are interested and ensure that you meet the entry requirements.

2. COMPLETE THE REQUIRED FORMS

Please ensure that you complete all sections, sign and date the required forms:

- International Student Application Form
- International Eligibility Checklist Form
- International Student Financial Declaration Form

3. DOCUMENTATION

All documentation submitted with your application must be certified or attested. A certified copy is a copy of the original document signed and dated by the organisation that issued the original document, a government office, Public Notary or Justice of the Peace, confirming that they have sighted the original. Certification of the original documents can also be done by your education agent.

Applicants will need to provide the following:

- Academic results and education certificates (if your documents are not in English they must be translated into English by an authorised person/organisation)
- English language test score, if applicable
- Passport pages with your details
- Evidence of employment activities, if applicable
- Current CoE (s), if applicable
- Current visa label, if applicable

4. SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

To submit your application by email, scan and attach the International Student Application Form and attested copies of relevant documents to an email addressed to: **international@kangan.edu.au**

To submit hard copy of your application, you can take your application to your nearest education agent representing Kangan Institute. To find your closest agent, get in touch with Kangan Institute International at **international@kangan.edu.au**

5. NOTIFICATION

All applicants will receive written notification of the outcome of their application. Applicants may be contacted to provide further information or documentation.

If successful, you will receive an Offer and Acceptance Agreement. It is important to read your Offer and Acceptance Agreement which includes a list of the terms and conditions, refund policy and payment instructions. Applicants that do not meet all the entry requirements may be issued with a Conditional Offer and Acceptance Agreement which lists the conditions that applicants must satisfy prior to acceptance.

6. ACCEPTING YOUR OFFER

The following steps outline how to accept your offer:

- Ensure all conditions outlined in the Offer and Acceptance Agreement are met, if applicable
- Complete all sections of the Offer and Acceptance Agreement
- Select a payment option and arrange payment
- Provide evidence of payment

You can submit all pages of the completed Offer and Acceptance Agreement along with evidence of payment of fees via email **international@kangan.edu.au** or via your education agent.

7. PAYMENT OF FEES

Payments can be made directly into Bendigo Kangan Institute's bank account. Please include your reference number in the electronic transfer. You must provide evidence of payment when accepting your offer.

8. CONFIRMATION OF ENROLMENT (COE)

The CoE will be issued once all the documentation is received and your payment is processed. Your CoE will be emailed to you or your education agent.

Your CoE is required to apply for your student visa. Please notify the International Department of your visa outcome either directly or via your education agent.

▪ ELICOS ▪ ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAMS – DOCKLANDS

Our English Language Centre at the Docklands campus is city-centred and a short stroll from public transportation (free travel on tram if you live in the city), Melbourne’s famous boutiques and trendy cafés. The campus is also close to Queen Victoria Market, Southbank, Yarra River and the city’s main sporting precinct, which makes for some exciting class excursion destinations!

At this campus, we offer the following English Language Courses:

- General English
- English for Academic Purposes – EAP

You will learn using innovative print and audio-visual resources, technology (iPads and VR goggles provided during lessons) with regular class, individual, pair and small group work activities providing excellent opportunities to practice communicating in English.

Our teachers enforce an ‘English only to be spoken’ rule in the classroom to ensure all students improve their language skills as quickly as possible.

ASSESSMENT AND PLACEMENT

Students are tested for proficiency during orientation and placed in a class according to their English language level. Our class sizes vary from 10 to 18 students.

CLASS ASSESSMENT AND PROGRESSION

Assessment includes class activities, assignments, presentations and tests. Students generally spend 10 weeks at each level. For example, a student who enters the programme with an IELTS score of 4.5 would generally require 20 weeks of ELICOS to reach the equivalent of IELTS 5.5. Students who complete the upper intermediate, advanced levels or EAP receive direct entry into courses at Kangan Institute. Please refer to individual courses for English language entry requirements.

OUR TEACHERS

All classes are taught by fully qualified and highly experienced teachers with specialist qualifications in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL). Our teachers have lived and taught in Europe, the Middle Eastern Gulf, Asia and Latin America.

ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES

In addition to timetabled classes, students can access our free support classes, library hub and the computer laboratory. As part of the students' ELICOS program, we also organise a range of educational excursions and activities regularly so that students can visit areas of interest, participate in the various industry visits, socialise and use their English in practical situations. The cost of these excursions is subsidised by the Institute. Students may also join one of our clubs to make new friends and practice communicating, such as coffee and conversation, pronunciation, reading and supervised self-study.

Students may choose to do fewer weeks at the General English, EAP and IELTS levels but will not be awarded a completion certificate.

GENERAL ENGLISH (NON-AWARD)

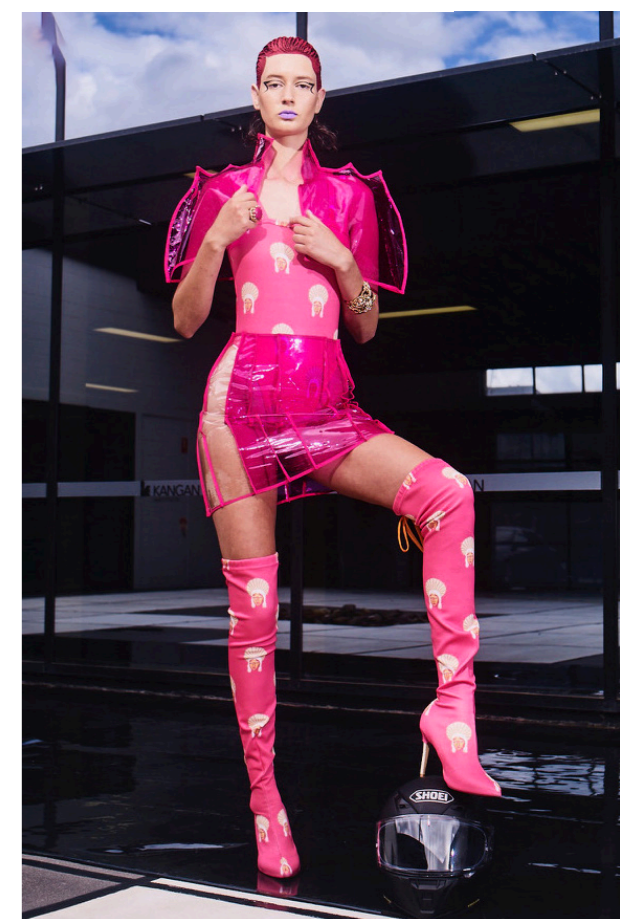

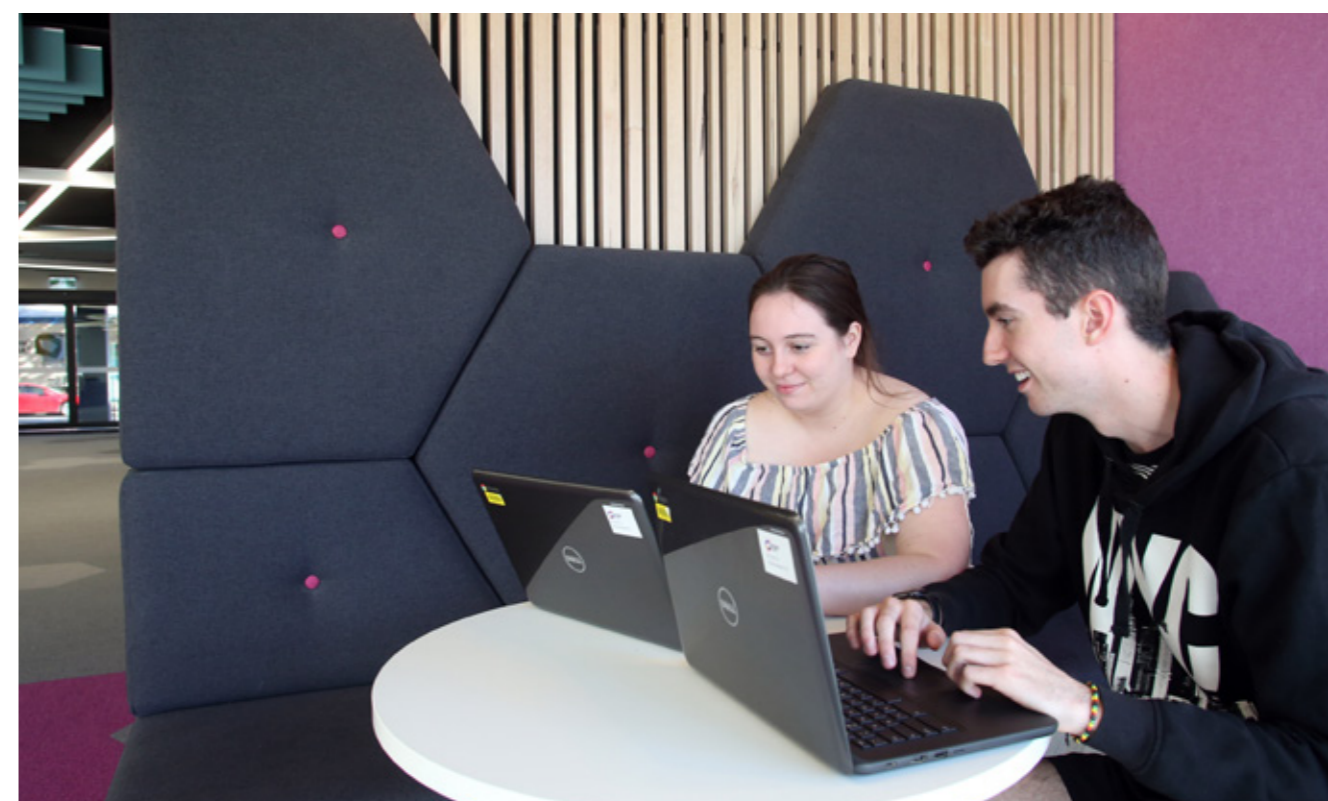
