Mature Students

This designation allows applicants to be considered for admission based on the skills and experience they have acquired since leaving school. Nov. 1 is the earliest date you can receive an offer of admission for programs that begin in the upcoming academic year. Offers of admission to highly competitive programs will be sent to successful applicants after Nov. 1 on a rolling basis, based on GPA.

Confirm your offer of admission at ontariocolleges.ca by May 1 to secure a seat in the program of your choice.

4 You're Almost There!

Once you've confirmed your offer of admission, you can log into myCampus for important information and notifications. Be sure to pay your tuition deposit and fees by the specified deadlines. We will send an email to your Fleming address, and to any other email address you have provided, to let you know your Fee Notification is available for you to review.

If required, provide proof of successful completion of admission requirements for your program to ontariocolleges.ca.

NEW! Ontario Colleges can start sending offers of admission beginning Nov. 1.

Be sure to apply before Feb. 1 to receive equal consideration for admission to programs with various start dates during the upcoming academic year. (Generally, September, January and May.) You can select up to three programs of your choice at Fleming.

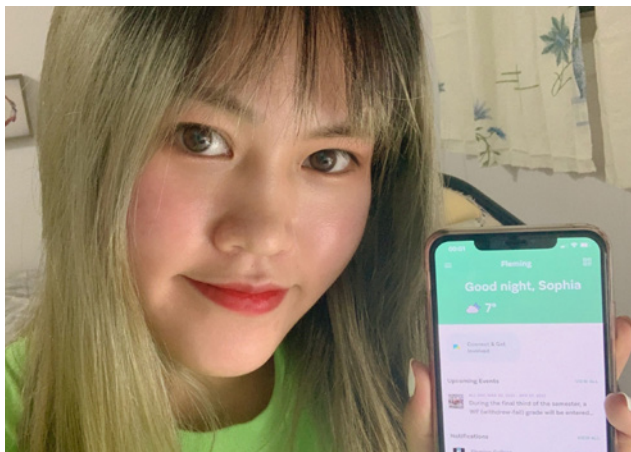
Through leadership activities, mentoring and tutoring programs, there are many opportunities for students to get involved and help other students.

Athletics

Get active! Our athletics and recreation programs include fun intramural activities as well as extramural leagues and competitive varsity sports.

Full-time students at Sutherland Campus have access to the Peterborough Sport and Wellness Centre, located on campus. It features a triple gym, aquatic centre, and weight/fitness training facilities. We also have four ball diamonds and two world-class artificial turf fields right on campus.

The Field House is a gymnasium that hosts intramural sports and fitness programs for students at Frost Campus. The Lindsay Recreation Complex is located adjacent to the campus and has a pool, two ice pads, fitness classes, weight training and cardio gym, and squash courts.

Our Haliburton Campus has numerous options for outdoor recreation with its network of on-campus trails and location on the shores of Head Lake. We offer a free bike and snowshoe sign-out program for students to stay active year round.

Common First Semester

Core diploma programs in the School of Justice and Community Development and the School of Environmental and Natural Resource Sciences share a common first semester while many diploma programs in the School of Business and Information Technology share a common first year. Common first semester allows you the freedom to explore and obtain a multidisciplinary perspective, while you acquire a base of knowledge and fundamental skills. You might find that a different program is more suited to your goals and interests. If so, you can transfer into your preferred program in semester 2, depending on enrolment capacity and academic requirements.

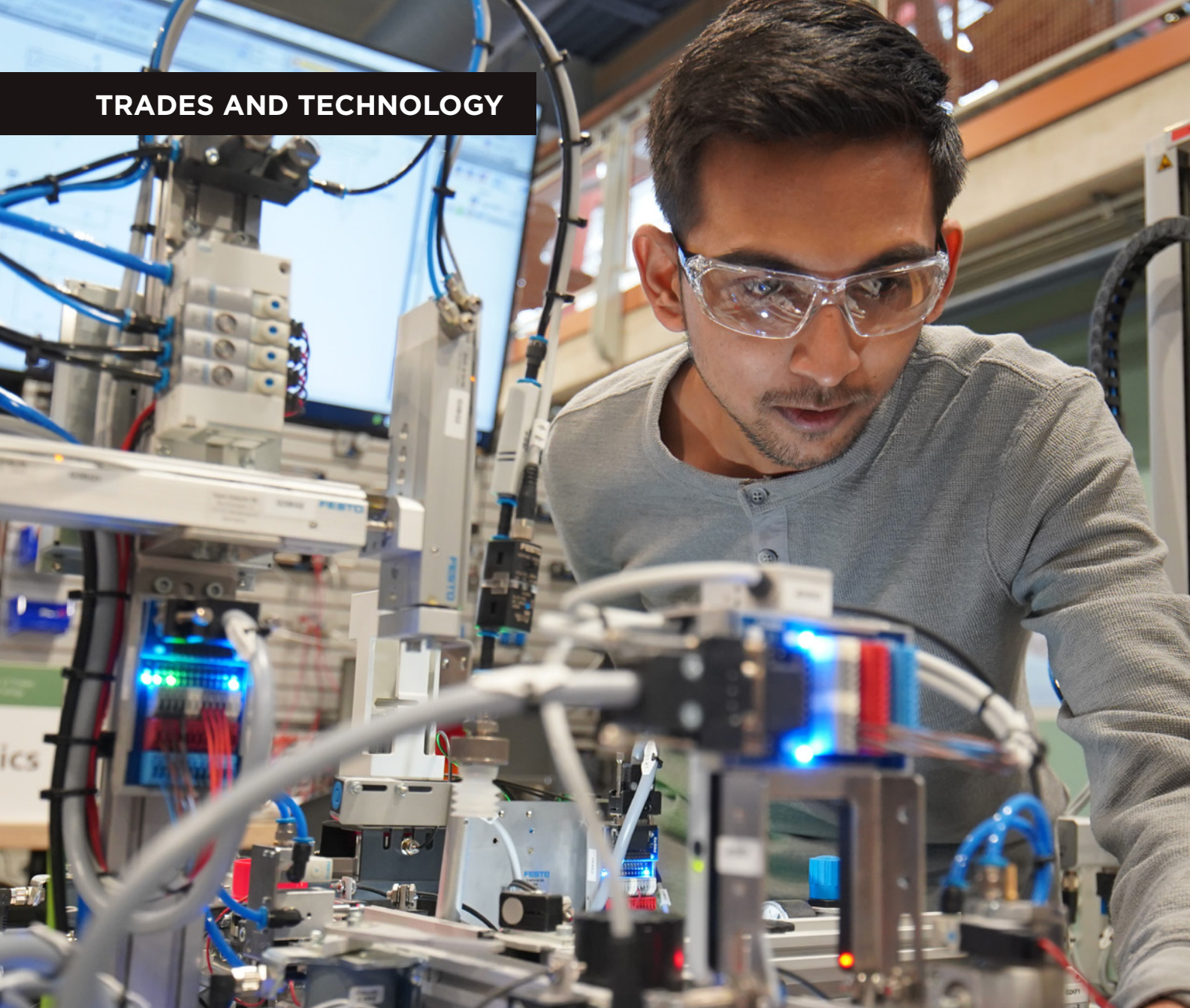

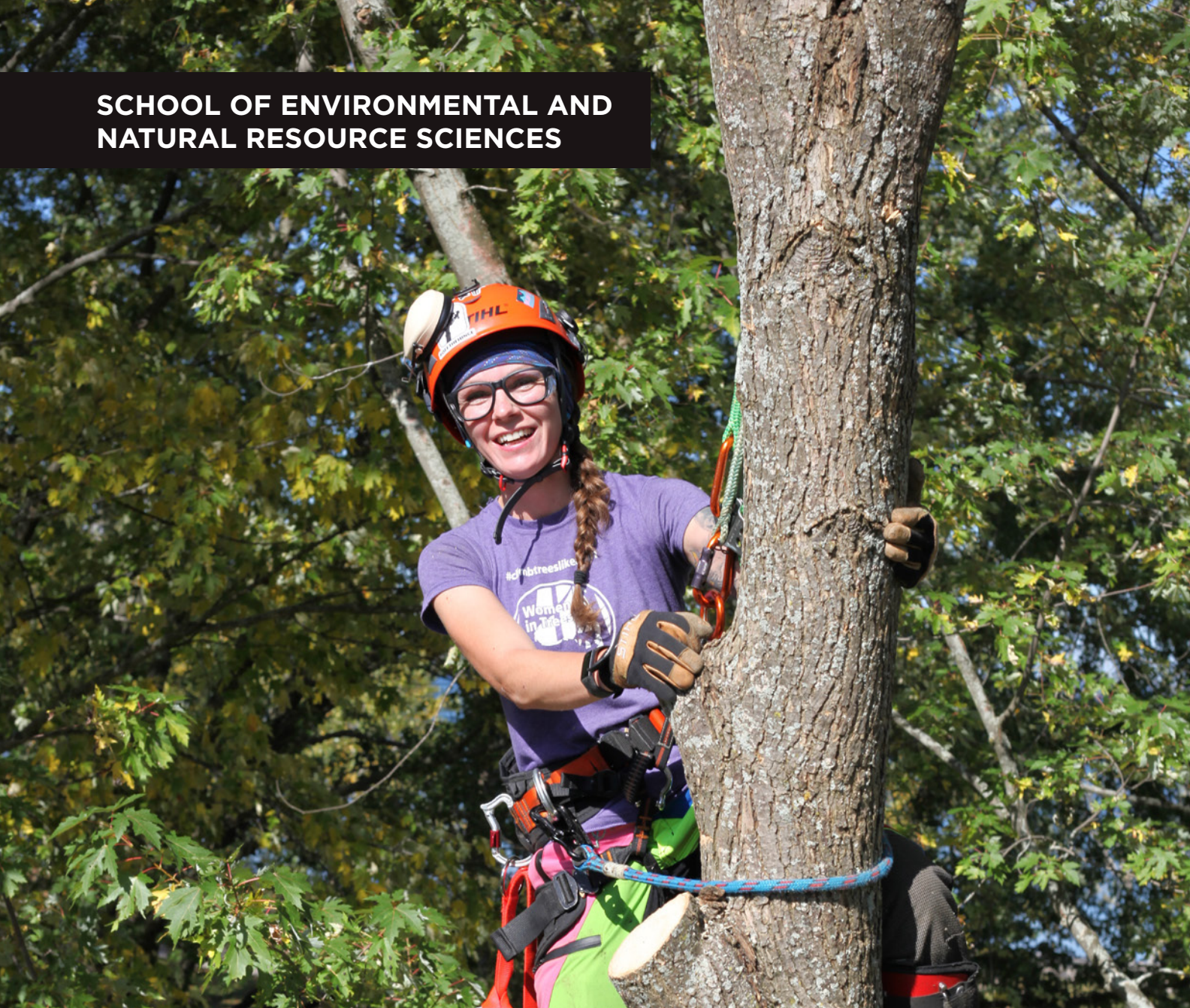
