Submit Your Intent-to-Enroll

By submitting your Intent to Enroll, you are officially accepting our offer of admission. Only those students who notify us of their intent to enroll will be registered into classes.

- 1. Visit the <u>International</u>
 <u>Admissions web page for</u>
 <u>admitted students.</u>
- 2. Click on the "Submit your Intent to Enroll" button.
- 3. Follow the instructions in the online form.

Activate Your U.S. Immigration Record

All international students must pay a fee to the U.S. government for the activation and maintenance of their Student & Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) record. This must be done at least 72 hours before your visa interview. The fee can be paid at www.fmifee.com.

- \$350 for F-1
- \$220 for J-1

U.S. Transfer Students

Your new I-20 will be issued after your current school transfers your SEVIS record to us. Transfer processing must be completed prior to the end of the second week of classes.

Apply for Your F-1 Student or J-1 Exchange Student Visa

Complete the online nonimmigrant visa application (DS-160). You can do this as early as 365 days before the program start date on your I-20 (F-1) or DS-2019 (J-1). We advise that you begin the process at the earliest date allowed.


Tips for a Successful Visa Interview

Chico State offers virtual support sessions to help you prepare for your visa interview. You will receive an email invitation with more details about these sessions.

Be Prepared to Take These Items to the Embassy:

Your embassy or consulate will have instructions for what you need to bring to your visa interview. These are some of the documents they may ask for:

- Admission letter
- I-20 (F-1 students) or DS-2019 (J-1 exchange students)
- Valid passport (good for six months or longer)
- Proof of financial support while studying
- Transcripts from prior educational institutions
- Proof of English proficiency
- Receipt showing payment of I-901 SEVIS activation fee
- Embassy/consulate visa processing fee





Class Registration

After you submit your Intent to Enroll, you become eligible for class registration. The Office of International Education is here to



assist with registration of students into their first semester courses.

If students wish to change their class schedules, academic advisors will be available to assist during Orientation.

Tuition and Fees

All F1 visa type students pay registration fees each semester. Because the California State University is supported by taxes paid by California residents, non-resident students must pay additional per unit fees, called non-resident tuition. - Making friends & getting involved on campus


Academic Support

The English as a Second
Language (ESL) Resource

homework assistance, classroom
presentations, writing research
papers, and vocabulary
development. We are the only
California State University that
offers this special assistance to
international students!

The Student Learning Center

(SLC) is a free tutoring center offering support in a variety of general education and major subjects. It also conducts workshops on time management, study skills, and test taking. Additionally, the SLC provides free, one-on-one writing tutoring at the Writing Center, which many international students use, in addition to ESL Support Services.

Each college within the University has its own team of Major
Advisors and College Success
Centers to provide personalized guidance and assistance with class schedule planning, information on major options, professional development opportunities, and progress toward degree completion.







Health & Wellness

The following facilities and services are available to all International Wildcats:

- -The <u>WellCat Health Center</u> provides nonemergency medical services to students, including treatment for cold, flu, or other minor illnesses. Medicine is available for discounted prices.
- -The WellCat Counseling Center provides individual and group counseling services. Some of the many issues they help students explore are stress, loneliness, anger, homesickness, sadness,

relationships, and anxiety. All services are, by law, completely confidential.

- -The Well at Bell Memorial Union provides opportunities for self-care including nap pods, massage chairs, designated quiet spaces, meditation and yoga classes, and spaces for prayer and reflection.
- -The Wildcat Recreation Center (WREC) is an on-campus, state-of-the-art exercise facility which offers personal training, group exercise classes, a climbing gym, a pool, recreational sports, and safety courses.

Comprehensive Employment Resources

The Career Center assists

students with career planning and development and provides support during the job search process. They offer one-on-one career advising, provide workshops, and host several career fairs each semester. There are also in-person and virtual workshops for Optional Practical Training (OPT) opportunities offered throughout the school year.


