Admission requirements

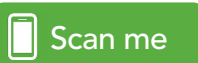

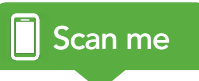

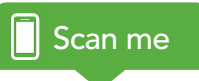

Learning outside the classroom

Hands-on learning experiences that occur with industry partners

Any program with the following work experiences requires you to obtain a work permit in order to complete the program and graduate.

Co-op

Co-operative Education has been designed as a process by which students integrate their academic education with work experience related to their programs of study. This integration affects much more than simply earning a salary, including the adjustment to the work environment and the development of professionalism. It also reinforces skills and theory learned during academic semesters, develops professional contacts, job knowledge and career paths, improves human relations and communication skills, and promotes personal maturity and financial independence. The employer will provide feedback to the instructor on the student's performance. Co-op placements are normally a full semester in length, and involve each student seeking out and securing their own full-time employment. You can complete your co-op wherever you want (as long as you become eligible to work there), this includes Canada, your home country or anywhere else.

Field Placement

Field placements are the practical application of the theory and assignments experienced in the program. Skills acquired in the program are practised and enhanced, while job performance is evaluated by potential employers. Activities vary from placement to placement, but should include preparation and completion of assigned activities. Placement hosts are asked to treat students as junior employees and expose them to the day-to-day workings of the industry. This can take place during an academic semester or on its own. Although your instructors may help you find a placement, it's up to the student to seek out and secure a field placement. You may or may-not be paid for this placement, based on the agreement with your employer.

Clinical Placement

Think of clinical placements as a class that occurs outside of the classroom, in the industry. Clinical placements are courses within your academic semester that you are graded on and that give you experience in the field. These are organized by your instructor, who will be present with you and your entire class for your scheduled clinical placement each week.

Internship

Internships are generally the length of a 14-week semester. They normally happen after all of your academic semesters are done and you don't have other classes. Students will work directly with host agencies and will gain practical experience in a field related to your program. Internships are normally completed on your own, without your classmates or instructor. Although your instructors may help you find an internship, it's up to the student to search out and secure their own.

Practicum

A practicum placement is around 10 hours a week and will allow the student to consolidate the theory learned in the classroom in a real-world environment. The practicum experience provides the opportunity to develop communication skills through assessments, teaching/learning and participating in collaborative relationships.
