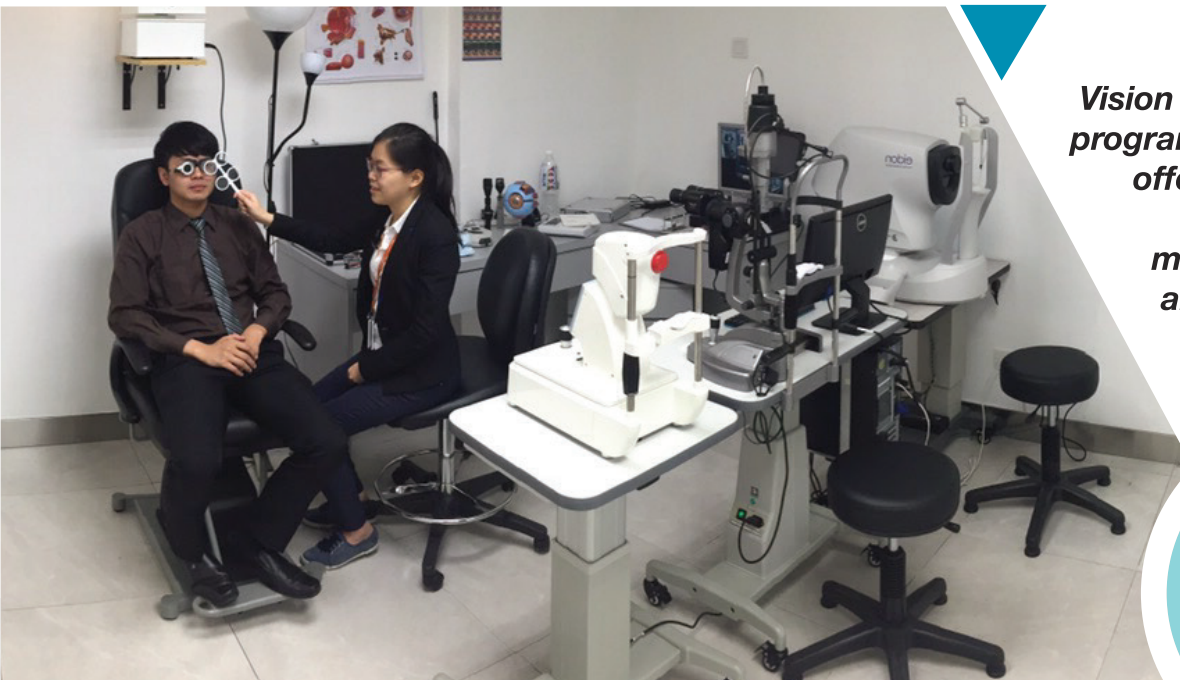


Diploma in Opticianry

There is an increasing demand for qualified opticians following the revelation made by the World Health Organization that approximately 40 percent of Malaysians are diagnosed with vision problems. More ambitious individuals may also opt to specialize in the development and implementation of ways to protect eyes from occupational strain or injury. Practicing opticians are also the members of the prestigious Malaysian Optical Council. The programme is approved by the Malaysian Qualifications Agency, thus enabling the graduates to secure rewarding career, or to further their studies at any institution of higher learning.



Entry Requirements

- SPM / SPMV / O-level or equivalent - Min 3 credits (2 of which are in Biology Physics, Chemistry or Mathematics) and pass in English; or
- Certificate in Science - Min CGPA of 2.0
- Fellow of British Dispensing Opticians (FBDO) UK or equivalent; or
- UEC - Min. 3B's (2 of which are in Biology, Physics, Chemistry; or Mathematics) and pass in English
- Certificate of Optical Technology min CGPA of 2.0.
