

Life in the UK

- We have taken care to choose a home where we think you will be happy. Living in a British home can be a very
 enjoyable experience, but you should be prepared to adapt as it will be different from living in your own home.
- Please remember that your home is not a hotel and to fit into British life you will need to respect any house rules
 your host has. Remember too that all families are different.
- The way you approach your hosts will influence how they approach you. You will find that politeness is very important in Britain as in most countries. It is a matter of simply using polite expressions like 'Please' and 'Thank you', 'Could you...?' or 'May I.....?'. This is the language used in everyday life in Britain for even the simplest requests and using them will certainly warm the family towards you.

Your Homestay

There is of course no such thing as a 'typical' British homestay. Your hosts may be young, middle aged or retired; their attitudes may be anything from 'modern' to 'old fashioned', and their interests anything from art to football. But they will be kind and friendly, even if at first a little reserved. In Britain today, couples are not always married and both partners often work, whatever the standard of living of the family. Because of this, it is becoming more usual for the whole family, husband and children, to help with the household jobs (eg washing up). Although you are not expected to clean the house, it is considered polite to offer to help with little things such as setting the table for dinner, clearing away or drying the dishes and you may find this helps you to feel more a part of the family. If the family has a pet dog or cat (some have more than one), you may be surprised that they are treated as important members of the family.

Terms and Conditions

- 1. Applying to study with Spinnaker School of English A course application to study with Spinnaker School of English is necessary and you can apply using one of the following methods:

- Via an approved agent: Your agent will advise you on the different courses we provide and will help you complete the application form.

Acopy of the student's Passport or ID is necessary to start the enrolment process. Until course payment or a Sponsor Financial Guarantee has been received by the School, no enrolment can be confirmed. Most Spinnaker School of English courses are conducted and designed for adult learners. We do also accept students who are 16 and 17 years old onto the same courses.

2. Paying for your course

Course payment must be made to Spinnaker School of English before the student's start date in British pounds (GBP) by:

Bank transfer

or

• Cash at Reception (please ask for receipt before leaving reception area).

Students are reminded that payment by bank transfer may take as long as 5 working days to reach our account: adequate time must be allowed for this. Payments are required in (GBP). Students are responsible for all bank charges and exchange rate fees, both in the country of origin and from England. Unless otherwise stated, the course price does not include any of the following: external exam fees, personal or medical insurance, travel costs. In addition to the relevant course or class fees, there is a registration fee of £60 payable for documentation, and administrative support. This includes student ID card, coursebook(s), course completion certificate and support letters. Tuition fees are only valid for the person specified on the invoice and/or enrolment letter and are not transferable to others.

3. Refund policy

Refunds will only be issued in the following situations:
(a) Visa refusal (for non-EEA students requiring visas before entering the UK)

- On production of the original visa refusal letter, the School will fully refund the tuition fees, minus a £150 administration fee and any bank charges incurred in transferring the money back to the source bank account.
- Any accommodation money will be refunded in full minus the £60 accommodation arrangement fee, providing we have two week's advance notice. If the student notifies us less than two weeks prior to date of arrival to the family, we will deduct one week's accommodation fee (that amount will be paid directly to the homestay family to recompense them for having to keep the room unoccupied for the potential student)

(b) Self-cancellation prior to course start

- If a non-visa student cancels less than two weeks before their course begins, we will refund the course fees minus one week's course fee and any bank charges incurred in transferring the money back to the source bank account.
- If a non-visa student cancels more than two weeks before their course begins, the School will refund their course fee minus a £60 administration fee and any bank charges incurred in transferring the money back to the source bank account.
- If a non-visa student cancels less than two weeks before arrival
 to their booked accommodation, the School will refund their
 accommodation fee minus one week's
 accommodation fee and any bankcharges incurred in
 transferring the money back to the source bank account.
- If a non-visa student cancels more than two weeks before arrival to their booked accommodation, the School will refund their accommodation fee minus a £60 accommodation finding fee and any bank charges incurred in transferring the money back to the source bank account.

No refund will be given in the following situations:

- If a student who has been issued with a Short-term Study Visa letter signed and stamped by the School cancels their course before their start date (for any reason other than visa refusal), no refund will be given.
- Self-cancellation (or ending your course early) after the course starts.
- Any study days lost through personal sickness or holidays will not be refunded but will be added to the end of the course.
- A student being deregistered by Spinnaker School of English due to consistent low attendance (Less than 80%).
- A student being asked to leave the School because of serious misconduct (i.e. abusive behaviour) on their part.
- Astudent being asked to leave the country by the British Authorities.
- A student being refused re-entry if he or she leaves the UK during the course without a covering letter from Spinnaker School of English.

One-to-One tuition

If a student arrives late for a lesson, the missing minutes from the class will not be credited. In the event of non-attendance by the student without contacting the School, money will not be refunded or lessons added on to the end of a course.

4. Students aged 16 and 17

 We welcome students aged 16 or 17 on our adult daytime courses. To accept a student, the parents/ guardian will be required to complete a Parental Permission Form (which needs to be submitted together with the application form).

5. Course extensions

If a student extends their period of study, they will not be required to pay any additional course enrolment fee (£60).

6. Visas

Some nationalities require visas for the UK and are advised to visit the United Kingdom government website (https://www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa/y) or to contact the nearest British Embassy, Consulate or High Commission to check on current visa requirements. Students who are visa nationals are required by Spinnaker School of English to attend full-time (daytime) courses of a minimum of 15 hours per week.

Spinnaker School of English is fully accredited by the British Council.

7. Course allocation

We are unable to allocate a student to a specific class before registering at the School. On arrival at the School for registration and before joining a course, a student will have to do a placement test. Students cannot change from one course to another without formal approval by the Director of Studies.

8. Attendance and Conduct

All students are required to attend their classes regularly and on time. Any student whose attendance level falls below 80% during the course for which he or she is enrolled will receive a written warning and may be dismissed by Spinnaker School of English without any refund of tuition fees if their attendance level continues at below the required minimum. For visa national students, this could affect their legal status in the UK.

Students are expected to participate actively in their class, to take progress tests periodically, and to do homework regularly. The School reserves the right to refuse re-admission or to dismiss any student in the event of serious misconduct or perpetual lateness (without a satisfactory reason). In such instances there will be no refund of tuition fees.

Examples of serious misconduct and abusive behaviour

- Verbal or physical abuse to a student or a member of staff. Verbal abuse can include bullying, harassment, threatened violence, damage to personal property, abuse on grounds of physical, racial, sexual, sexual orientation or national differences. Physical abuse includes actual violence, sexual harassment or indecent assault. This applies on or off the School premises.
- Deliberate damage or misuse of School resources or vandalism to the School building or property.
- Misuse of IT facilities by downloading offensive, pornographic or extremist material.
- Theft of School resources or another student's/member of staff's personal property.
- Repeated refusal to follow the School's rules.
- Behaviour outside the school that could bring the School into disrepute.
- A student breaking UK law (e.g. drug abuse or driving offences).
- Bringing illegal drugs, alcohol or offensive weapons into School or coming into School under the influence of either.

10. Student holiday policy

- If a student tells us their intended holiday weeks before starting their course, these weeks will not be considered as study weeks and will not be charged for them.
- Holidays can only be taken as complete weeks (Monday to Friday) and replacement weeks will be added on to the end of a course.
- Extended periods of leave can be granted at the School's discretion, provided there are extenuating circumstances.
- If you want to take a holiday, you must request it at least one week before you take it.

The above applies to all Spinnaker School of English students. However, Sponsored Students may have to follow their specific sponsor's rules.

11. Certificates

Students will automatically be given an attendance certificate and academic report if 80% attendance or more has been achieved for the period for which enrolled.

12. Publicity

From time to time, the School may take photographs and/or videos of students for promotional purposes. By enrolling at the School, each student tacitly accepts that any photographs taken of you or comments made in questionnaires issued by Spinnaker School of English may be used for promotional purposes. Students can withdraw their tacit consent by writing to the Director of Studies.

*Students aged 16 and 17: their parents will give or refuse consent within the original consent form completed when the student joins the School (Check point 4 above).

13. Data Protection & Student Records

Students are responsible for giving the School accurate and up-to-date information about their address, phone numbers, e-mail address and emergency contact details in the UK and home country whilst studying at the School.

Spinnaker School of English will collect and maintain your personal information lawfully and fairly, in accordance with the 1998 Data Protection Act. This confidential information will be protected against loss and theft or unauthorised access, disclosure, copying or modification. It will not be supplied to third parties. We will only disclose it without consent if any regulatory or governmental body requests or requires it.


