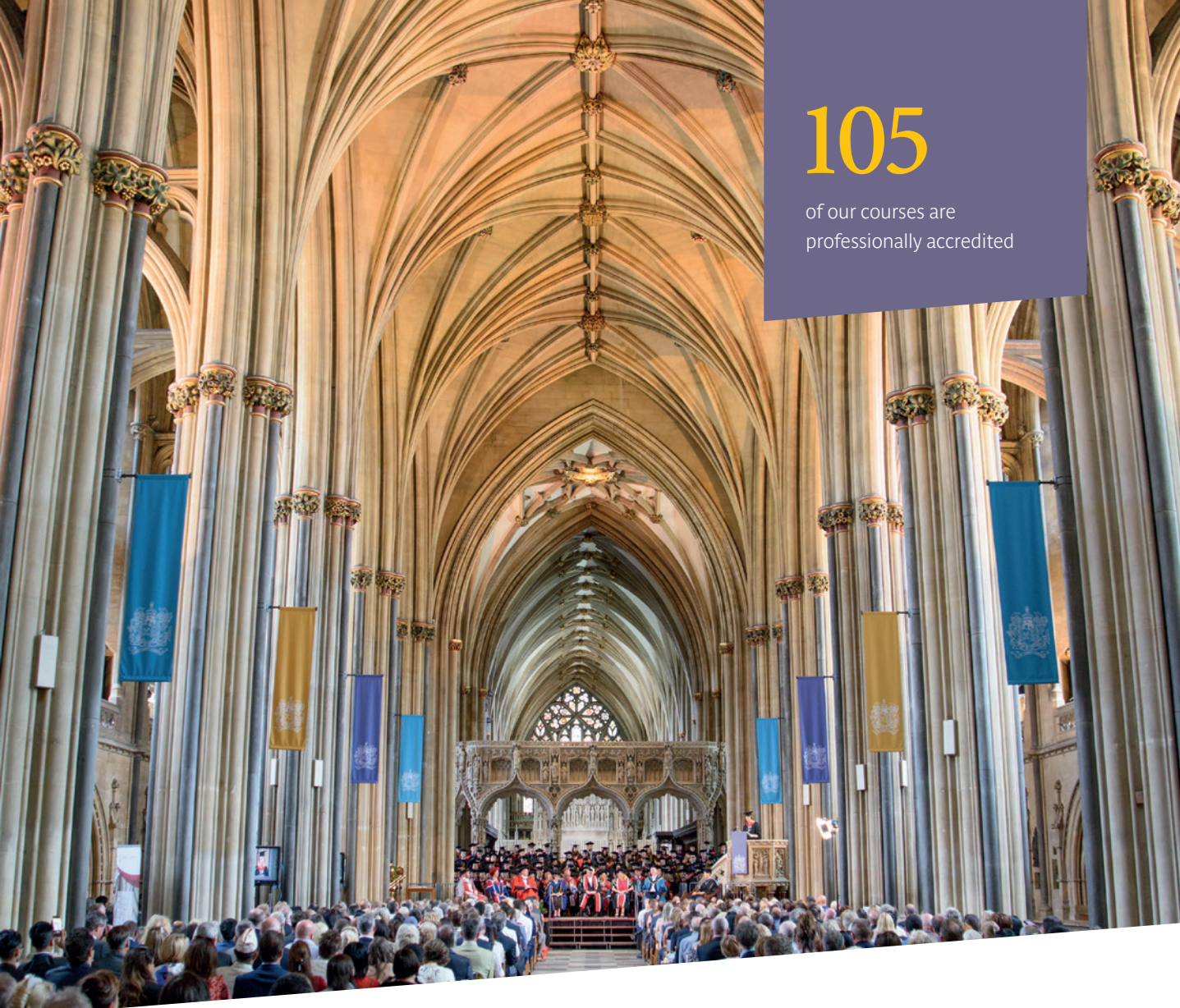

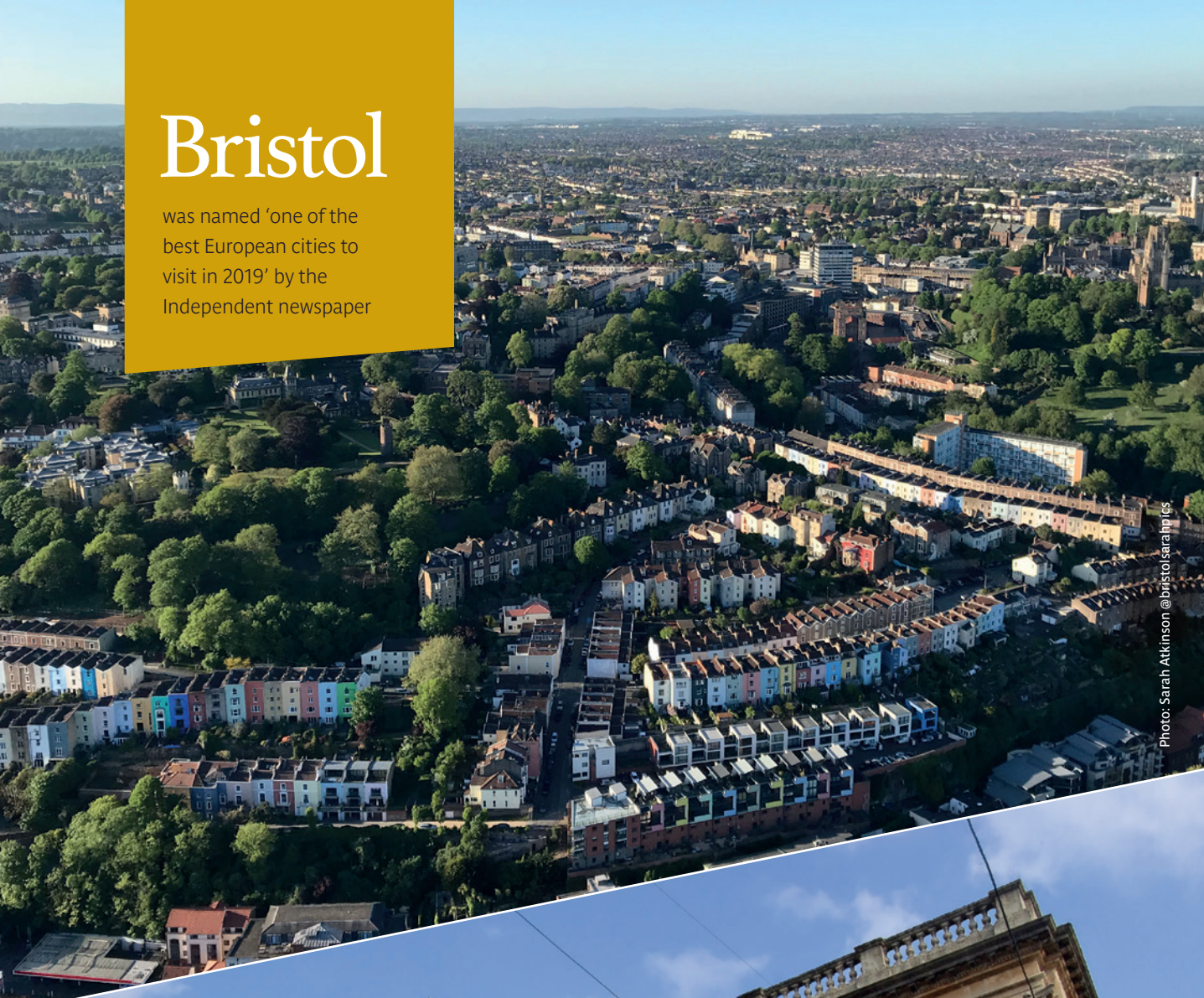

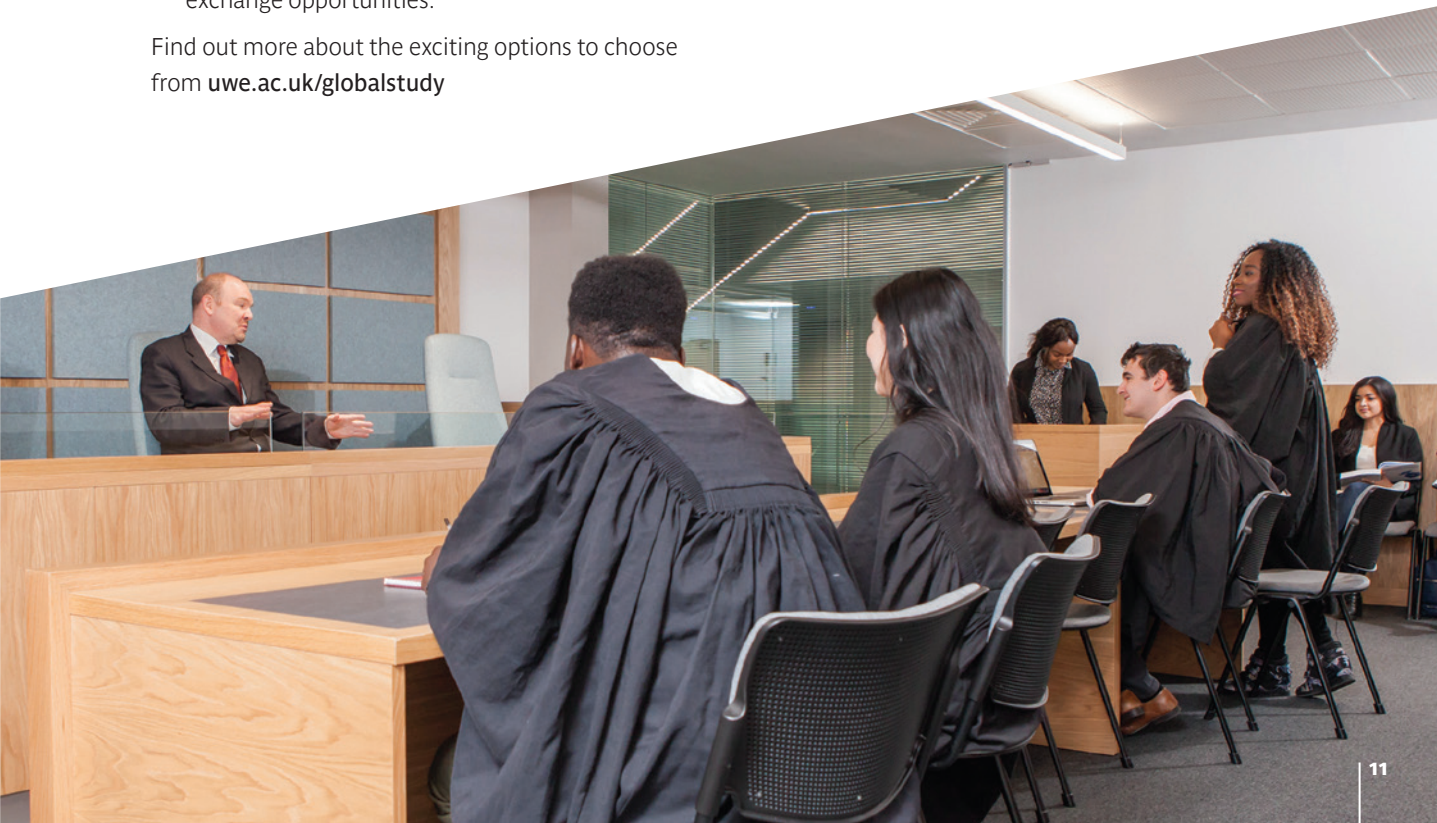

# FRENCHAY CAMPUS

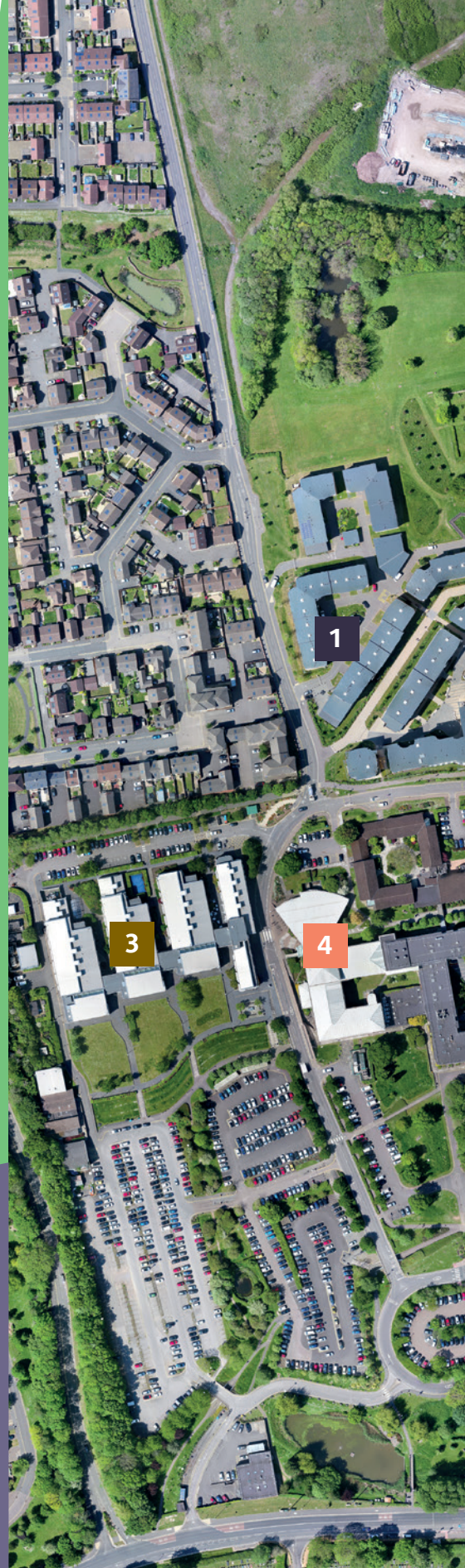

# CITY CAMPUS

Our creative and cultural industries campus spans the city and consists of several sites at Bower Ashton Studios, Spike Island, Arnolfini and Watershed. Bower Ashton is the main hub of the Campus and is where teaching takes place for the School of Art and Design and the School of Film and Journalism.



## Creative City

Bower Ashton is set in peaceful ancient parkland a stone's throw from the iconic Clifton Suspension Bridge – while our Spike Island, Arnolfini and Watershed facilities are right in Bristol's creative heart, where you'll be working alongside industry pros and practising artists.

# GLENSIDE CAMPUS

Situated in beautiful grounds in the Fishponds area of the city, Glenside Campus is just three miles northeast of the city centre. The beautiful surroundings provide an inspirational place to study.

Our new Clinical Skills Centre opened here in 2018, in a former Grade II listed NHS laundry. This new centre provides modern teaching and learning spaces for trainee paramedics, occupational therapy students, nurses and undergraduate optometrists.



## Did you know?

As well as our clinical and optometry suites, there's also a Crime Scene House at Glenside. Forensic Science students gain experience in a setting that is similar to a real crime scene.

# YOUR ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS

We want you to feel at home from the moment you arrive, and that's why we offer a range of accommodation options to suit you – both on and off campus. Wherever you choose to live, you can feel assured it will be safe, well-equipped and comfortable. You'll live in a friendly community either in a shared flat, house or hall – but your bedroom is your own personal space.

## Typically you can expect:

- A furnished single bedroom with a bed, desk, TV point and fast internet – many are ensuite too.
- Modern kitchens – shared with a group of other students.
- Communal areas for relaxing and catching up with friends.
- Laundry facilities and bike stores.
- CCTV and a security team for peace of mind.
- Gas, electricity, water, contents insurance for personal possessions (except bikes) and internet connection are all included in your accommodation fees – no unexpected costs.

## Frenchay Campus accommodation

You'll have a choice of three options – the Student Village, Wallscourt Park and Carroll Court. Benefit from all of Frenchay's facilities, living only minutes away from your lectures.

# WHICH COURSE IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

We've included the courses that are likely to be of most interest to you in this prospectus; but many more are available. Please see our website for all available courses.

## **Pre-sessional English Programme**

Our course is designed for international students who need to reach the level of English language skills required to study at UWE Bristol. The course will enable you to cope with all aspects of studying and living in the UK.

## **International Summer School Programme**

We have a range of summer schools on offer where you can improve your English language skills, enhance your knowledge of a subject you enjoy, develop your professional skills or simply spend time in the UK experiencing British culture.

## **Distance learning**

Distance learning allows you to study remotely without being in regular face-to-face contact. Some courses may require you to attend the University at times for study sessions.

## **Undergraduate bachelor's degree**

This is usually a three-year degree course and the award is either a Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Science (BSc), Bachelor of Engineering (BEng) or Bachelor of Law (LLB).

We also offer MEng(Hons) and MSci degrees in certain subjects. These are undergraduate master's degrees, which have an additional final year of postgraduate-level study built in so you graduate with a master's-level qualification.

Some architecture degrees, some engineering degrees, and all degrees with an optional placement year, last four years.

## **Postgraduate taught master's degree**

This usually includes nine months of teaching plus a three-month research project, which can be undertaken anywhere in the world. The award is either a Master of Arts (MA), Master of Science (MSc), Master of Law (LLM) or Master of Business Administration (MBA).

We also have two-year master's courses in both Information Technology and International Management, which have the option of a placement to gain experience. Please note that while we support students to do this, we cannot guarantee the availability of placements.

## **Postgraduate research degree**

The Professional Doctorate (Prof Doc), Master of Research (MRes), Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) and Master of Philosophy (MPhil) are all research degrees with little or no teaching involved. Research degrees take at least two to three years to complete and often longer.

# UWE BRISTOL'S INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE

## Your path to UWE Bristol

UWE Bristol's International College is a joint educational partnership between UWE Bristol and Kaplan International Pathways. Based at Frenchay Campus, the International College offers a pathway for international students who need to gain the necessary academic and English language skills to qualify for degree entry.

You'll benefit from small class sizes, expert teachers and regular one-to-ones, and you'll also be able to use UWE Bristol's facilities including the library, PC labs, study spaces, Centre for Sport and Students' Union.

## What is a pathway course?

If you have completed high school or university, but don't meet the entry requirements for our undergraduate or postgraduate degrees, you can gain a place through a pathway course. This will give you the skills and knowledge needed to progress onto your degree at UWE Bristol. You're guaranteed entry\* to your degree course as long as you pass at the required level with good attendance.

## On-campus pathway courses

### Foundation Certificate

To qualify for entry to an undergraduate degree at UWE Bristol, you can take a Foundation Certificate, which will fully prepare you and then allow you to progress to the first year of your degree.

## International Year One (IYO)

If you've finished high school with good grades, you might qualify to study an IYO. This combines university preparation with content that is similar to that of an undergraduate first year, allowing you to progress directly to the second year of your degree.

## Pre-Master's

If you already have three years of higher education or equivalent from your home country, but you don't qualify for entry to a postgraduate degree, a Pre-Master's is ideal. This will bring your skills up to the level needed for entry onto a UWE Bristol postgraduate degree.

## Off-campus pathway course

### Pre-Doctorate

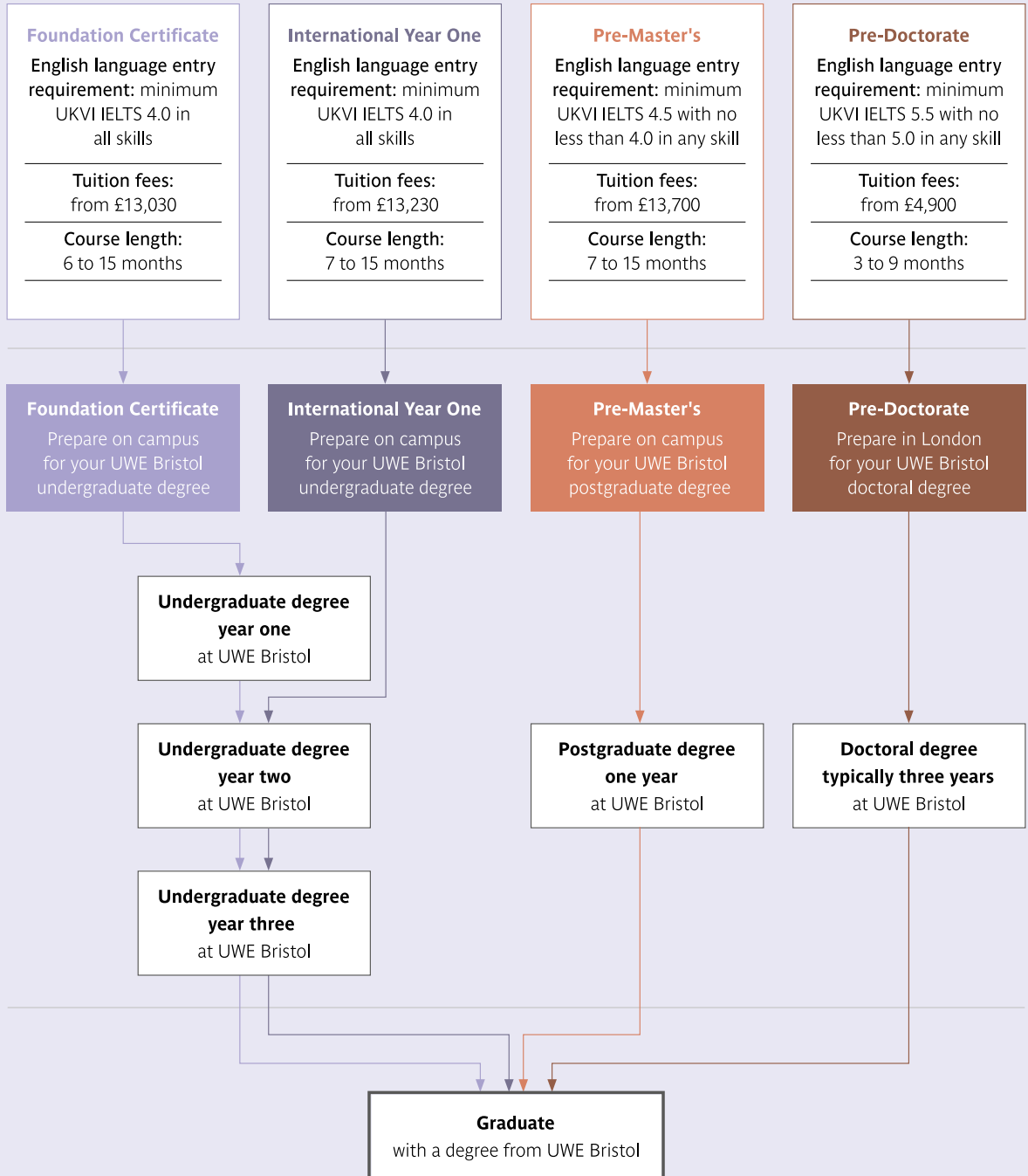
If you already have a degree, and wish to study a UWE Bristol doctoral degree, you can prepare with a Pre-Doctorate at Kaplan's International College in London. 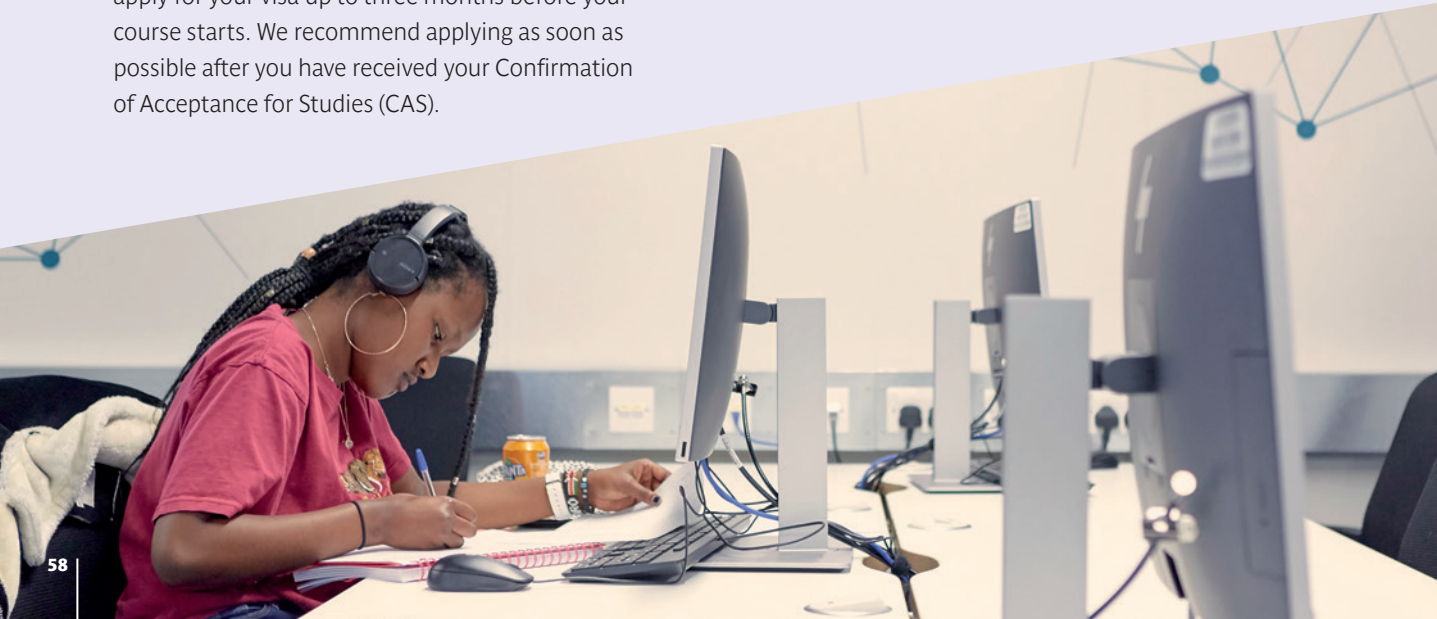
